In the beginning:

You can't help but to appreciate walking from car to barn without the sting of the air; Spring is here!

We have several guests today, and my list is MIA.

Our speaker is Kathy Le.

She is the first born child to an immigrant family, so felt driven to set the bar for three more siblings.

She describes following the script to success expected by her parents but feeling it was not her path. Ultimately she was going to be a storyteller. She earned her stripes in the industry with an unpaid internship in Lloydminster. Determined to put in the hard work necessary to get there and to stay in the industry, she arrived in Calgary. She is now a reporter and also anchor for CTV weekend.

As a point of personal passion she shared with us a Fentanyl crisis video. An experience close to home led to her wanting to tell this story. The crisis crosses all barriers across our community. She wanted to provide an opportunity for families to talk about addictions and the risks of these drugs. Fentanyl has changed the game for everyone involved from rehab and support to law enforcement and health care. More than 500 deaths in Alberta last year from opioids.

North America has a large dependency on options for pain management. Replacing one drug (oxycontin) with another led to a substitute that has had other consequences. It is now flowing in from China in every shipping method possible. And its easy to order via electronic methods.

The drug problem is not new, but the deaths are.

She is presented with a certificate showing our appreciation by vaccinating 40 people as part of our Polio Plus efforts.
