Guest Speaker

Walter Zuk introduced our guest speaker Lori Williams who's topic was the 2019 Alberta Election. Ms. William has taught at Mount Royal University for over 25 years and is an Associate Professor in the Department of Economics, Justice and Policy Studies. She is a regular commentator on municipal, provincial and national political life. Her research interests include women and politics, law, Charter rights, political philosophy, ethics, power and technology, including social media. Lori teaches courses on Canadian politics, women in politics, law and politics, and political philosophy. On a personal note Lori was born in Saskatoon but has lived in Calgary most of her life. She has three grown children and enjoys horse back riding and hiking.

Ms. Williams topic of *Election 2019 Alberta Political Issues* compared the leaders, platforms and policies for what are considered the top four political parties running, NDP, UCP, Liberal and Alberta, in this upcoming election. Ms. William highlighted the leadership styles of Rachel Notley, Jason Kenney, David Khan and Stephen Mandel and indicated that in Alberta it is really a two party race between the NDP and UCP. She noted that although Rachel Notley is a popular leader who's hallmark style is brining people together to be consultative and collaborative, the NDP party is not popular. For Jason Kenney, he is not seen as a popular leader although the UCP party is popular. Lori compared the Parties platforms in the ares of healthcare, education, economy and deficit reduction. She also touched upon the Party's plans with regards to climate change, carbon tax and pipelines. Ms. Williams provided a great deal of information to digest.
