Stephanie is passionate about community service and global citizenship and has spent most of her career working in the not-for-profit sector. She moved to Calgary in July after beginning a new position with CAREERS The Next Generation, and is work-

ing on increasing their presence and awareness in the Calgary community.

Stephanie is also the President Elect for the newest Rotary club in Red Deer – the Urban Spirits Rotary Club – and enjoyed working last year as the club service chair to develop an innovative grant program, and facilitate community engaging in the club.

Summary of Stephanie's Presentation:

CAREERS is a non profit dedicated to career exploration for high school youth, connecting them with Paid internships in the Trades. Goal is to help youth understand a career in the trades (regardless of academic levels.) Focused on youths strengths to help them pick a trade, could be for any youth. Students earn credits towards high school and to their trade through the registered apprentice program.

ACTION: Looking to connect with companies looking to hire a student in the Trades or connecting youth who may be interested in exploring a career in the trades.

Q. Who Funds you?

A. Non-profit supported by Government/Industry.

Q. Any careers outside of the trades?

A. Only for trades – niche focus, and the main purpose of the program.

Q. Worries about retirement of individuals in trades?

A. Still a big problem, lots of people are leaving, and it's important to replace them.

Q. Work with Junior Achievement?

A. No – have an age restraint, and only work with High School Students.

Q. Targeted to specific high schools?

A. Not really, the program works with all schools, 500 around alberta – aiming to grow to 1000.
