Motions passed this meeting:

"I move that RCCHP provide \$5,000, from restricted funds shared equally between Community Services and Youth Services committees, to Heritage Park Historical Village to provide funding for children in grades K-8 in Calgary to participate in various programs in the School Program."

"I move that RCCHP provide \$1,000, from restricted funds, to the Southwest Communities Resource Centre. for the purchase of a replacement LCD projector, and approximately 10 textbooks for the Positive Discipline in Everyday Parenting program."

"I move that RCCHP provide up to \$10,000, from restricted funds, to Calgary Urban Project Society for the purchase of two commercial stoves."

"I move that RCCHP provides up to \$1,000 for the purchase of painting supplies required to paint 3 suites at the Alcove Addiction recovery for Women."

"I move that RCCHP provide \$1,500 to send the Calgary Prostate Cancer Centre's Man Van to the District Conference Center in Olds."

"On behalf of the Youth Services Committee, I move that RCCHP support Adventures in Human Rights Program in the amount of \$1,900 from unrestricted funds to cover the cost of 1 student to attend the program in 2019, including \$1200.00 registration, flight cost to be determined, and \$100.00 student allowance."

"On behalf of the Youth Services Committee, I move that RCCHP approve \$1,200.00 to send one student to Adventures in Forestry and Environmental Studies in Prince George, B.C. May 23 – 27, 2019."
