Guest Speaker: Karl Kjarsgaard, Director of Bomber Command Museum, Nanton, Ab.

"Restoring HALIFAX" (#1 utilized bomber plane from WWII)

Karl delivered a dynamic and engaging presentation. Canada had 15 RCAL Bomber Squadrons in WWI, with the "Halifax" being flown 66% of all missions. Its bomber design was reworked in 1937 to take four Rolls-Royce Merlins; there were approx.. 6000 built; the Halifax had a range of 1,860 miles (3,000 km), and it could carry its full bomb load of 13,000 pounds (5,900 kg) to ranges of 1,000 miles (1,600 km). The "Murphy Crew" was the only flight crew to successfully fly 30/30 missions without being shot down. All seven members of the Murphy crew received distinguished Flying Award (a rarity). One "Halifax" managed to fly 96 missions without being bombed. The loss of flight crew members on bomber planes in WWII was 76% (avg. age= 20-22 yr. old). "Halifax 57 Rescue (Canada)" is a project to restore a "Halifax" for the Nanton sight. Salvage rights have been obtained by the Canadian Gov't & Karl's group for a downed WWII "Halifax" located off the southern coast of Sweden.
