Don MacArthur introduces Bill Skinner. Retired geologist, RCCHP member and founder of Highlands of Guatemala project. Today Bill is talking about RI Global Grants. Future Vision is the new set of operating rules for Global grants going forward. Clubs can have several on the go at once. For example Downtown club has 10 going on at one time. That is the max. Working with a local partner Rotary Club, plan is to work with seven local schools. Near second largest city in Guatemala. It can be hard to find local clubs who are amenable to taking on a project. The WASH project is proposed by the local Rotary Club of Los Altos Quetzaltenango. Bill has visited several of the villages in the municipality. The typical family doesn't have enough land to grow adequate food for themselves and so there is poverty. Schools often have poor sanitation, including latrines that may be located up the street. Part of the program is to train water guardians. Keep aware of water issues such as contamination... WASH provides education and a health kit to educate on hygiene. "It is hard to teach keeping flies off the table when your time is spent trying to put food on the table" says Bill.

Bill has met with staff of Agua del Peblo and the Director-General and the person responsible for training. Training teachers is sustainable as parents are focused on immediate needs. Cost is estimated at 14\$ per child.

The local club is primary and we as sponsor have obligations. Doug and Eve have agreed to be co-sponsors of the proposal. There is a primary year of training and then a year of monitoring. Leveraged at 8.6 - 1.

Bill is currently working on the documents and has the benefit of having the previous proposal handy. A key issue is that all grants need to demonstrate the local need, and that cost can't be part of the grant.
