GUEST SPEAKER:

Doug Hood introduced our Guest Speaker, Christina Hassan, co-founder of Full Soul, noting she is currently articling in Law. Christina holds a Masters Degree in Public Health; has written several associated research papers; and is an active member of Fish Creek Rotary Club (Club President next year). Christina was recently acknowledged as one of top six People of Action at the United Nations.

Christina spoke of the impact Rotary has had on her life. As a youth, Christina had a wonderful experience on a Youth Exchange and later became active in Rotaract. These involvements set the stage for a "life of service", reinforced by a dramatic experience in a Uganda delivery room.

In Uganda, Christina was rushed into the delivery room to provide some assistance to a woman called Alice who was hemorrhaging during childbirth. Christina observed there was a large amount of blood loss; but while there were plenty of healthcare professionals in the room, there was inadequate medical tools and equipment that might have saved Alice's life.

Soon after this dramatic emergency room experience, Christina and her husband co-founded FullSoul, a not for profit organization, focused on the supply of medical kits with medical tool and supplies to hospitals in Uganda. These medical kits are supplied in order to protect the health and safety of mothers, babies, and healthcare workers during child birth.

Apparently Christina likes a challenge. While managing and directing activities at FullSoul, Christina successfully completed her studies in law. During her studies, Christina often took her young baby son with her to class, and during her final exam, excusing herself briefly to nurse her baby son, returning to complete the exam.

Christina expressed her sincere gratitude to Rotary, in particular Rotary District 56, for the funds to allow FullSoul to continue with its mission.

She expressed how honoured she felt at learning of the United Nations Award and the uplifting experience when the reward was received, delivering her acceptance speech with her head held high and leading the break-out session at the United Nations.

Christina asked us to shout-out the word "Sindica" which means "push", as an inspiration not just to women giving birth in Uganda but also as inspiration for all of us to "push" ourselves to make a difference.

Bill Skinner thanked the Guest Speaker, noting the effective ongoing leadership she is providing to Rotary's efforts in the third world.
