Mike indicated the Rotary Inclusion Committee is in a 3-way partnership with Inclusion Alberta & the Alberta Gov't to ensure persons with developmental disabilities are considered by prospective employers without being blocked by the "ordinary application process". with developmental disabilities is that more than 80% DO NOT have employment; without a job, they do not feel (or get treated) like contributing members of society. A video was shown with various employers providing warm testimonials of why employers (private & public sector) should consider opportunities with Inclusion AB. Evidence was provided in spades documenting the successes and sustainability of this important multi-level business, community, and government initiative. One of the program's employees, **Ashley R.** was then invited by Mike to come to the podium to speak firsthand about her direct work experiences as a Costco employee with mentorship from Inclusion AB. Nothing beats a glowing live testimonial about how a program has changed one's life. She's a remarkable young woman with a bright future now, thanks to her newly secured position of employment, and the mentorship/support from Inclusion AB.
