

Youth Exchange Experience

Bill King introduced Celina Guadagni from Prince Rupert who is a first year VIU student studying Sports and Recreation Management. Celina was a Rotary outbound stu-



dent who visited Brazil for the year spanning 2012 and 2013. She left for Brazil in 2012 and the first pictures she showed the club were of her with her host family and friends during Christmas in Brazil.

Celina choose Brazil because she meet a Brazilian student before she left on the Exchange program and she found her fun and exciting and wanted to experience more of the Brazilian people.

She stayed with two host families and during this time went on two major trips

in Brazil. She showed us several pictures of her travels including a 10 days trip up the Amazon. She also went to Rio de Janeiro where it was over 40 degrees.

For Celina, the best thing she experienced in her one year exchange was the chance to meet friends from all over the world. Some of the friends she met were from US, Belgium, Denmark, Japan and China.

Only the host father spoke some English and her host family did get her a tutor but when she first travelled to Brazil she had no knowledge of Portuguese and now she can speak it fluently.

She went to Rotary every Tuesday and the meeting was all in Portuguese and for the first two months she nodded a lot. She showed us some pictures of her Rotary meeting with her Blazer and all the pins that she had accumulated.

Celina went to school from 6:15 a.m. to 12:30 when she would have lunch which was the main meal of the day. She found the first while since the language was all in Portuguese that she came home with head aches every day. There was no sports class. The students stayed in the same classroom and the teacher came to their classroom. However the school was very important to the students and school was taken very serious by everyone.

For Celina she summarized her experience by addressing the question – a year abroad for a Student what do they gain?

- ► Embrace a New way of life –she found the Brazilian people very loving and she gave an example of attending a lady's 80th birthday party where she was hugged by over 200 people
- ► Understanding New Cultures—Cecil said she has established friends from all over the world
- ► Gain Sense of the World
- ► Lifeline Friendships
- ► Loving New Family-Cecil still talks

to her host families every day after having come back to Canada for over two years.

Celina said that her travels affected her life significantly—she decided to go to University because of the Exchange program, and her world has been expanded. In the future, she plans many future trips such as Thailand, and Costa Rica

Bob Fenty thanked Celina for speak-



ing about the host program and he hoped that this would encourage our club to take on an in-

bound student, he asked **Charles Ramos** to speak about his experience being a host father to **Bos Bakker**, the current Dutch inbound exchange student. Charles said the host students are

very adaptable and easy to work with and it takes you out of your comfort zone. Because you want to show the student Vancouver Island you end up acting like a tourist and doing much more activities. All the exchange students are young and you must have connection to the internet. A challenge he has faced is time commitment, Charles solved this by getting a bus pass for the students and keeping some distance between Bos and his teenage daughter.

Susie Walker thanked the speaker and mentioned that her own daughter went to visit Brazil and said it was the best place in the World. She congratulated Celina and gave her best wishes from the club.
