> **Program Notes from April 1, 2016** By Lucie Gosselin

The program today was presented by our own Debbie Narver who attended PETS (President Elect Training Seminar) in February. She shared a video of the speech made by one of the speakers, Rick King.

Richard D. King is a past world president of Rotary International, and the senior partner in the California law firm King, King & King. He earned undergraduate and law degrees from the University of California at Berkeley where he is a member of the California Club and the Order of the Golden Bear. He taught law at Brigham Young University. He is a distinguished military graduate of the University of California and served as captain in the U.S. Military Intelligence. He received an Honorary Doctorate in Law from Hanyang University, Seoul, Korea.

The main theme of Rick's presentation was uncommon leadership. He pointed out that the most important job in Rotary is not the District Governor, it is the one of president because the work Rotary does comes from the club and the president is the leader of the club. He quoted his favorite definition of leadership. A leader is someone who influences change, someone who influences people to do something, someone who influences people to act, often when they don't want to act because they resist change. The uncommon leader changes that.

His closing advice to the presidents elect was that your success depends on the conviction of what you know about Rotary, your vision for your club and the amount of commitment you feel. He went on to ponder all the great things Rotary does and all the avenues of



service the president is responsible for. The list is quite exhaustive when you think of it.

Like all past presidents of our club who attended PETS, Debbie came back motivated and impressed with the seminar.

PETS is a seminar that every club president elect is expected to attend prior to being installed. In our club, president elects attend the Pacific Northwest PETS usually held in February in Seattle every year. We have 9 Rotary districts attending the same seminar which means over 500 presidents elect and over 100 assistant governors participating. Added to that are District Governors and Past District Governors. The beauty of having that many participants is that funds are sufficient to afford some of the best speakers. All of them committed to Rotary and with motivational messages. As someone who attended PETS in 1998, I believe it is the best reward for being president.
