Brenda Grice reminded members that the club will match with recognition points any donation to Rotary Foundation of \$100 to \$250 made this month.

John Salem donated two pairs of golf club passes which were immediately auctioned off. Brenda Grice and Joyce Smith were the winning bidders with the proceeds going to Foundation.
