# Nanaimo Hospital Foundation Update

Janice Perrino was our guest speaker for the meeting. Janice joined the Nanaimo & District Hospital Foundation as CEO in August 2016. She is the former CEO for the Hospital Foundation of Penticton Regional Hospital. Janice also served two terms as the Mayor of Summerland, was the Chair of the Regional Hospital District and city Councillor for two terms.



This club has raised several thousands of dollars for the Hospital Foundation. Janice asked Rotarians "Why do we have to raise money for the Foundation?"

Janice gave us a bit of history and facts about the history of our medical system. **Tommy Douglas** brought Medi-

Doug served in the RCAF in WWII and upon his return from the war he attended UBC law and had a long and distinguished career retiring as a provincial court judge. He was not only active in Rotary, but was active in Ashlar Lodge, Shriners and a number of societies in Nanaimo.

In his youth Doug enjoyed flying, boating and spending summers with his family on Long Lake.

care into Canada at a budget of \$22 million annually. Now, Island Health's budget per year is \$2.2 billion (\$5.4 million per day). In 1960, there was a major expansion of the number of hospitals (NRGH was built in 1963). In 1968, seven hundred drugs were covered by Medicare-today Medicare pays for 25,000 drugs. In the past, most of the care was focused on babies and broken bones, now it is on the aging population. Last year the hospital performed 13,516 surgeries, 65,088 ER visits (the busiest on the Island and our ER is the finest in Canada), 1,218 babies were born, 7,065 Renal patient visits and 3,123 Pediatric Ambulatory (day) visits.

Island Health employees 19,600 Health care professionals, 1,900 physicians and services. 767,000 people on the Island are being served which is 16% of BC. The foundation supports the Hospital and Dufferin Place, Oceanside, Telehealth, Trillium and Eagle Park.

The reason to raise money for the Hospital Foundation, Janice explained, is that there is not enough money available to support medical care. For example, current life expectancy for a woman is 82 years and it is projected with the baby boomers that by 2050 there will be a huge glut of health care issues since the last two years of life are very costly.

Last year the Foundation bought one of the two new CT scanners at a cost of \$900,000. Other programs that it has supported over the last five years was EC Cardiogram, Digital Mammography Machine, Emergency Department Equipment etc. Janice ended her program by thanking everyone for support of the Nanaimo Foundation for past contribution and future contributions.

Questions—How many hours is the CT scanner used. Answer the scanner is available from 6:00 am to 11:00 pm. Question—Is the Hospital Foundation still running the lottery for life? Answer—no, the Foundation is trying to spend less and give more. They are moving their offices

back into the Hospital proper to save money and reduce the overhead costs.

Susie Stephens thanked Janice for coming to speak to us and gave her one of our famous Rotary pens.
