Visit by District Governor Rose

Past Assistant District Governor Brenda Grice intro-



duced the current District Governor Rose **Bowman**. Ms. Bowman comes to us from the Chehalis, Washington club, of which she has been a member since 1996. She has had a distinguished career, having served two terms in the Washington State House of Representatives, and together with husband Leon, owning and operating their own business since 1968. Ms. Bow-

man is a multiple Paul Harris awardee and bequest society benefactor.

District Governor Bowman brought greetings from the

District to all and recognized her husband, **Leon**, without whose love and support she wouldn't be standing before us today. She presented a pin with the motto, "Be a Gift to the World", to Vincent Kusi-Kyei, Rotaract member from Ghana, and visiting our club today.

DG Bowman gave a brief biography, discussing her childhood in Oklahoma, and the strong religious beliefs within her community and family. Her grandfather was a

minister who travelled constantly with the family, and their family hosted many young missionaries which exposed her to global issues, most particularly those in Africa.

She joined Rotary in 2006, and spent a few years of membership without getting too involved, but became much



more deeply committed as time went by. Her time with Rotary has been filled with adventure and excitement, as she related in the following story: At one point, the Campbell River club was trying to find and purchase a bus to transport mentally and physically challenged students school in Mexico, so Rose attended a surplus vehicle auction to help out, and ended up driving away with a 16-passenger handi-

capped-accessible bus with a wheelchair lift for \$500.

Many different organizations then donated time, money, and expertise to fix the bus to a serviceable state, including a new paint job and the school logo in Spanish. Then somebody needed to drive it from Washington to Mexico, so Rose and another Rotary member, Alex, volunteered. The bus was loaded with wheelchairs and the journey began. All went well for the first few hours, then the bus engine died near Portland. Rose noticed a municipal Public Works yard off the side of the highway, so went to ask for help. The workers towed the bus for free and did a full diagnosis. The verdict: out of gas. Apparently the fuel gauge was one of the items not repaired. From then on, a log of mileage was kept and no further problems were experienced.

DG Rose mentioned that the story of the bus perfectly encapsulates the spirit of helpfulness that Rotary brings out in people. At every point where something was needed, and it became known that it was for Rotary, people and organizations immediately donated huge amounts of time, money and effort to help out. It has been her experience that people

around the world are always eager to help Rotary, and that membership in such a prestigious organization opens doors anywhere one goes. She has visited several countries on Rotary trips and is always humbled by this humanitarian spirit.

She concluded by relating statistics on the polio campaign, noting that Rotary is all about service and neighbours, and unites people all around the world. It is a persevering organization that provides lasting solutions to systemic problems, and the broad range of membership provides an incredible diversity of perspectives. She finished with the question, "Are you a member of Rotary, or are you



a Rotarian?

President Lila Tanner thanked the District Governor for her truly motivational talk, and wonderful style of delivery. Lila said that our club, and she personally, were very inspired by Rose's message. Lila then presented **DG Rose** with a wooden pen handmade by **Dave Connolly**.

Government of Canada Partners with Rotary Foundation Canada to Eradicate Polio and Reduce Poverty in Developing Countries

An announcement has been made by the Canadian Government that will have an impact on the Canadian Rotary clubs within our District. One part of the an-



nouncement was the matching of funds on a 2:1 basis for donations made by Rotarians & Canadian Rotary clubs to PolioPlus for 4 years. This means with the Gates match it is a 5:1 match!

The second part of the announcement is just as exciting. Senior Rotary leaders in Canada have been working with the Canadian government for funds to be used on our international projects. Canadian



Rotary clubs & districts will be able to access government funding through TRF Canada that will then be used to obtain further funds from the World Fund of TRF. The Government of Canada will contribute up to \$6 million to support Rotary Foundation Canada's efforts to help advance maternal, newborn and child health, secure the future of children and youth, and increase sustainable economic growth in under-served communities in developing countries.

The mechanics are still being worked out and we should see more news in September.
