

Citizenship: Judge Gerald Pash

by John Shillabeer The judge was introduced by **Guenter Raedler. Gerald Pash** was



born in BC and worked for many years in broadcasting in the Interior and then came to the Island and worked for the military in public relations. He has been a Rotarian for 45 years.

Judge Pash began by reminding us that until 1947, there was no such thing as a Canadian citizen. We were all British Subjects Resident In Canada. Canada was the first Commonwealth Country to introduce citizenship (in 1947) and citizen number one was William Lyon MacKenzie King.

Citizenship judges are independent and their decisions can be appealed to the federal courts. There are 37 citizenship judges in Canada of which approximately half are part time. Appointments to the citizenship bench are patronage appointments, but Judge Pash is proud that his nomination was supported by all three political parties.

To become a Canadian citizen, you must be able to demonstrate a working knowledge of French or English; demonstrate knowledge of Canada and you must be resident in Canada for three of the last four years. However the residency requirement is changing. A new Citizenship Act is coming into force over the coming 12 months and it will require a substantial physical presence in Canada in four of the last six years. It also will require that candidates intend to live in Canada. However, Judge Pash expects that this last requirement will be appealed in federal court before it is settled. The judge made it clear by citing examples that citizenship requirements are taken seriously, scrutinised

Vancouver Island Conference Centre NANAIMO, B.C. and enforced. He distributed a page of sample questions about Canada and said that to demonstrate knowledge of Canada, candidates must get at least 15 out of 20 right. However if a candidate fails the first time he or she can appeal and try again.

The responsibilities of citizenship are: obey the law, do jury duty when asked, vote, and to take responsibility for oneself and one's family. Citizen ship confers the right to vote, run as a candidate for federal office; hold a Canadian passport and the right for children to receive



secondary education in either French or English.

Judge Pash concluded his talk by donning his formal robes and administering the citizenship oath in English and French to us all. He also presented a certificate to President Bob Wilson, recording the renewal of our allegiance to the Crown and Canada.

Dave Connolly thanked the speaker and said he was surprised to find out that he was not born a Canadian citizen even though he was thankful that he had lived here all his life. He presented **Judge Pash** with a Rotary pen to mark the occasion.




