Susie Stephens stated that the book com-





**Promoting Rotary Using Social Media**by Don Bonner

President Jane introduced Don Bonner.
He joined Nanaimo
Daybreak Rotary Club
in 1997 and is a past
president and is a
multiple Paul Harris
Fellow . He has twice
been to Africa in connection with Rotary
Projects. Don works
in IT.



Don's talk was, in fact,

a live demonstration using Facebook. He focused on Facebook because it is the most commonly used social media software. This was born out through a show of hands when almost all the Club members indicated that they had a Facebook account. Facebook was originally a way to communicate with friends, but it has grown and developed so that it can be used to keep up to date with what is happening. People also use it to advertise though its primary purpose remains social networking.

Don recommended that to publicize events and/or news, we should put the content on a website and then anchor it to our club Facebook home screen. From that point it can be shared with friends who in turn should be asked to share it with their friends. This is the powerful multiplying effect of Facebook. Incidentally Don said that "Like" is not as powerful as "Share".

Items on Facebook remain visible until they are overwritten by something newer, so in general they don't stay visible for very long. This could be a concern for us when for example we are publicizing the Book Sale. We need to try and keep the Book Sale on potential customers' minds so they don't forget about it, or mix up the dates of the sale. If you "Pin" a post on Facebook it will remain visible.

"Boosting" on Facebook is another option.



This must be paid for and is only open to the administrator. Boosting ensures that your post or event is displayed prominently. An advantage is that the administrator sees lots of detailed statistics about the demographics of people interacting with the boosted event or post. As an example of the cost of boosting, Don said that Daybreak boosted their last Octoberfest event on Facebook at a cost of about \$50 for about 1000 hits. In return they collected information about the time of day the post was visited, the age and gender of those who showed some interest.

**Peggy Richardson** is managing our Club's Facebook account and is an expert. Don recommended that we work with her to use Facebook in the best possible way to get the word out about the upcoming Book Sale.

**Janeane Coutu** thanked Don for his very instructive talk and demonstration. It was
