

Nanaimo Child Development Centre

Debbie Narver introduced our guest speaker, Scott Bradford who has been the Executive Director of the Nanaimo Child Development Centre since September 2013. Scott was born and raised in Sault Ste. Marie Ontario and after university in London Ontario, spent 20 years in Ottawa raising his son and two step-kids while work-

ing in a number of jobs over the years, including the *Boys and Girls Club of Ottawa* where he spent 12 years as Executive Director working with over 4,000 young people across Ottawa offering no-cost, high-quality after-school, summer and weekend programs. He was a member of the *Kiwanis Club* of Ottawa before joining the *Daybreak Rotary Club* upon moving here. In 2013, he received the *United Way of Ottawa Community Builder Award* and the *Queen's Diamond Jubilee award*.

Scott began his talk by asking how many knew of the *Nanaimo Child Development Centre* (NCDC), which the majority were, and two members had children that received services at the centre. All are now during well, thriving in fact and were pleased with their experience at NCDC.

When Scott first came to the Centre, he was insecure around the parents and children and their issues. He was so impressed with their commitment and dedica-



tion to their children.

The NCDC is a 47-year old organization and serves children ages 1 through 17 years old. Children coming to the Centre have a diversity of reasons for coming; some are in wheelchairs, have development delays, autism, cerebral palsy, or have speech or audio issues. The Centre has 52 full time staff and 30 part-time staff. There are 1200 kids in the city receiving services, most are low risk and just need a bit of help and then they move on. Scott shared a story about **Katie**, a 15-year old client in a wheelchair who when they first met 3-years ago was super shy. Her nickname now is "the Bulldozer"; she says "I got tired of people ignoring me so now I just mow them over".

Recently the NCDC building on Nelson Street has had a bit of a makeover with bright exterior colours to make it more appealing to kids. Before it looked like part of the hospital or other medical building. It is a family centered practice, although many therapists go to the family home for sessions. Five years ago there were over 500 on the wait list, now half of that due to our community's generosity to fundraising. The Ministry of Children & Families provides 4.2m in annual funding, and fundraising brings in another \$300,000.

We need a few more volunteers to help, 2 hour shifts would be appreciated. We are also going to sort/price stuff on Friday afternoon (starting 5pm) and evening, for anyone able to assist or has items to drop off.

This pays for extra therapists to reduce the wait list. Fundraising efforts include the annual *Silly Boat Regatta* in July that will see \$118,000 raised this year and a Telethon will take place on October 4th. All funds raised through local initiatives stay in our community. The wait list today sits at 267 and their goal is to get to zero – this is achievable!

People from all over the Island move here to get services for their children. The NCDC offers physical, emotional and psychological services all in one place. They are a very unique organization in that they have such a great program and short wait lists in comparison to their counterparts in the province.

Scott ended with a story about one child with a goal to ride a bicycle. He was in a wheelchair and his parents got him an adaptive bike. During the winter he went through physical therapy to get the strength and skill to ride this bike in the spring. Come spring, he gets out in the park and is riding his bike on his own. He is yelling something but his Mom couldn't clearly hear him, and assumed he was cheering "I'm doing it". As he got closer, she realized he was yelling "I fit in! I fit in!" – that says it all.

There were many questions from the floor and some key messages were;

The faster you get to kids with autism, the more they improve overall.

Many children hit the school system before their development issues are diagnosed – parents need to reach out for help if they suspect any delays in their toddler's development.

There is no cost to parents to receive services at NCDC. Some families choose to pay privately for additional therapy sessions.

NCDC has a staff member termed "Family Navigator" to assist families in applying for grants of other funds available for therapies.



Janeane Coutu thanked Scott for his excellent presentation and presented him with the Rotary hand crafted pen as a memento of his visit.
