



Fabulous Ladies of Rotary

Our speakers last week were three of our own members. Billed as the "Fabulous Ladies of Rotary", **Brenda Grice** and **Janeane Coutu** walked us through the Rotary grant process, while **Wendy Pratt** gave us an example of the results of such Rotary generosity.

Program

Brenda opened the program by highlighting some of the ways our club and others in the area are using Foundation grants to local projects, and to introduce the other speakers. **Janeane** is



the chair of our clubs' community grants committee, and **Wendy** is a committee member speaking today from the perspective of a grant recipient.



Janeane's presentation identified the two areas of available funding for community projects: general community grants and District community grants. The District grants are her area of

focus. These are available for funding up to \$3,500, and are paid on a reimbursable basis. The application deadline is April 1, and the project must be complete by the following May 1. The six areas of focus that the grants are available to help with are:

- Peace and conflict prevention/ resolution\
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child care
- Basic education and literacy
- Economic and community development

Our club has taken advantage of this program for the past eight years, and new ideas are needed for 2015. Gener-

ally, one grant per year is available, but sometimes there is additional funding available, so it's always good to have a number of applications.

Wendy then spoke from the viewpoint of a grant recipient. While managing Nanaimo Hospice, the organization had the 'Serenity Garden' project funded through a District community grant. This project consisted of construction of a garden, a re-circulating river, and cedar fencing around the Hospice grounds. The peaceful setting created by the garden has had an enormous positive impact on Hospice users and caregivers, as the tranquil surroundings and privacy provide a calm place for introspection and reflection. Wendy identified a number of other positive impacts achieved with the community grants, including promoting health, providing incentives, protecting the vulner-



able, providing safe refuge, and providing nutrition to local children and youth.

The fabulous speakers were thanked by **Frank Shoemaker**, who mentioned that the club now has a better understanding of the grant opportunities, and we can benefit from (and contribute to) the energy of this committee.





A number of Rotarians were on hand Thursday night at Nanaimo North Town Centre as the mall hosted a Chamber of Commerce 'Business-After-Business' promoting *Festival of Trees*. Our Rotarians served the food and refreshments provided by the mall for the fifty-or-so local business and professional people who attended the function.
