



PROGRAM NOTES - February 9, 2018

Our Program plans today were changed at the last minute. Instead of **Mikel Knutson** telling us about his trip to London to visit the Queen, **Brent Barootes** gave his Classification Talk to the club a week early.

Brent Barootes is a multiple **Paul Harris** Fellow and is currently Sergeant At Arms Committee Chair.

Brent was born in Regina and at the age of 11-12 was sent to boarding school in Ontario. Brent always thought that he was sent to boarding school because he was a brilliant child. He was wrong.

Brent graduated from Western University and spent several years in sales in Ontario before deciding he did not want to be in sales so he got involved in the Restaurant business including early stints with a Greek Restaurant and Chichis Italian Restaurant before becoming Assistant Manager for Red Lobster in Windsor Ontario. He ended up being involved over an 8 month period opening 41 new Red Lobster Restaurants across Canada.

After the restaurant business, Brent moved to New Brunswick and became involved in the Night Club business. He joined Rotary in New Brunswick to help with his new work endeavour in 1989 and was with the Club for two years before moving to Calgary in 1991-1992.

Brent then became involved in the Calgary Flames organization with their radio station and was involved in different revenue sources to help the Flames Hockey Club. He was with the Flames for 10 years in the marketing of sponsorships for the club. Brent acknowledged that he was not much of a sports fan and admitted that he did not know who Lanny McDonald

was even though he was Captain of the Flames when they won the Stanley Cup.

Brent joined the Rotary Club of Calgary Olympics which was chartered in 1988 and had a total of 20 people in the club.

In 2001 Brent formed the Partnership Group to help organizations sell partnerships and is still working for this group as a sole employee.

Brent first found out about Nanaimo when his vacation to Mexico was cancelled due to 911 and he ended up taking a vacation to Vancouver Island, and in 2002 they knew that one day they would move to the Island.

In 2005, daughter **Brooklyn** who is a Paul Harris Fellow was born and each year they spent 4-6 weeks vacationing on the Island.

In August 2015 Brent and his family moved to Nanaimo

GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE - February 2018

Rotary's February Theme is Peace and Conflict Resolution.

Conflict and violence displace millions of people each year. Half of those killed in conflict are children, and 90 percent are civilians. We refuse to accept conflict as a way of life. Rotary projects provide training that fosters understanding and provides communities with the skills to resolve conflicts. Through our service projects, peace fellowships, and scholarships, our members are taking action to address the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, inequality, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources. Rotary makes amazing things happen, like:

- Improving quality of life. Rotary members founded the People for People Foundation, which has helped 10,000 families afford food, clothing, rent, utilities, medications, and other necessities.
- Raising awareness of bullying. Rotaract clubs in the Philippines conduct anti-bullying campaigns in schools to teach children how to handle conflict peacefully from an early age.
- Protecting domestic violence survivors and their families. The U.S. state of Louisiana has the fourth highest incidence of death caused by domestic violence. Rotary members met this issue by helping a shelter provide food, clothing, legal advocacy, and counseling to over 500 women in one year.

Two New Rotary Clubs! The Rotary E-Club of District 5020 was chartered in January, and a new club in the Comox Valley of Vancouver Island likely will charter in February. Chartering new Rotary clubs is one way to ensure we are offering the Rotary experience in new and different ways. The key is flexibility. Rotary is a membership organization; only through attracting new members will we increase our service to the world.
