History of B.C. Community Pipe Bands

We celebrated *Robbie Burns Day* at the meeting today and what better speaker could we have found than **Tamara Cameron**, our Pipe Major who piped in the haggis for our



lunch time meal. Tamara is the spouse of former club member **Kevin Cantelon** and has had the honours of piping in the haggis in past years.

Bruce Samson in full Scottish regalia introduced Tamara and said that her daily job is a business consultant involved in teaching people how to start a business. Tamara is a

Pipe Major in the Pacific Gael Pipe Band and during her talk she presented a power point presentation with a series of historic British Columbia Pipe Band photos.

With spring just around the corner, many pipe bands are contemplating the many events that they will participate in over the summer and she is wondering if the types of events today will be the same as the events that took place 50, 75 and 100 years ago.

When Tamara was young and first started playing in the pipe band she was overwhelmed with the number of summer events that she participated in from parades every weekend to our of town band tattoos and Canadian Pipe Championships across Canada.

Pipe Band venues have changed significantly since Tamara started and today they tend to be individual band events rather than parades and multi-band events. Outdoor Band Festivals are now far and few between. Tamara believes that this change is due to the extensive amount of organization required by a small group of volunteers.

Tamara's goal is to foster the recognition of bands, particularly pipe bands in this part of the world as serious musical organizations.

Tamara believes that the primary role of current Pipe Bands is to provide a regular recreational outlet for those who love to make pipe music. Pipe bands today are needing to find out what attracts audiences and fills the seats so that their music can be shared by many. They would also like to know what they can do to attract and motivate younger people to join bands.

Tamara has decided to start a Highland Dance Team where the dancers are members of the Pipe Band. This is

similar to what the White Spot Junior Band does in Vancouver.

The goals of Tamara's group is to define their goals for events and the longer term goals for the Band. Their four goals are 1)



make music with like minded friends 2) entertain an appreciative audience 3) acquaint the community with the Bands record over the years and 4) make the community and City Council aware of the Bands need to attract a younger population and the need for funding to cover their costs.

The current Pipe Band members are older and youth recruitment is paramount in order for the Band to be sustainable.

Tamara said that there has been a Pipe Band in Nanaimo for over 100 years and wondered what product the Band is trying to sell – is if the same product as the Bands sold 100 years ago. One hundred years ago there was no televisions or radio and the pipe bands were considered entertainment. It is not the same today.

Tamara feels that she needs to cultivate and nourish the community and City Council that the Pipe Band is a valued organization in the City. Without their support, the Band's very existence could be in jeopardy. She feels that today's Bands need to take their audience on a journey.

In the region of King James III of England in the 1600's, drums were used to "Beat the Retreat" which was a means of recalling the armies at the end of days fighting.

Tamara asked the club for our thoughts on how she could

reach her goals for a successful Pipe Band in today's market. Many good ideas came from the floor and Tamara was thanked for her great talk by **Joan Ryan**.
