Rotary Meeting Notes - Dec. 15, 2017

President **Jane Currie** called the meeting to order early with the national anthem. Our inspiration today was delivered by **Joyce Smith** who reminded us that Christmas is a time to be thankful. The speaker's program was next on our program to accommodate the speaker-Ian Kalina from the Boys and Girls Club.

Visiting Rotarians and Guests

Doug Cowling introduced his Guest **Peter Sinclair** of **Nanaimo Loaves and Fishes**. Recently the Rotary Club donated \$2,000 to the society and Peter asked to give Rotarians a quick presentation and update of Loaves and Fishes. In 2012, Loaves and Fishes went through a transition of viewing fund raising from a place of scarcity to a place of abundance. The directors looked at the issue of food waste—was it a problem or



an opportunity? They determined it was an opportunity—1/2 of the food produced is thrown out, this equals 185 kg of food per person per year or \$87,000,000. So Loaves and Fishes agreed to accept all food regardless of the quality to avoid generating food waste. This food would be categorized first the best quality for people, second quality for animals, third quality for composting and finally quality for landfill. In Nanaimo, Thrifty's, Country Grocer and Super Store participate in the food recovery program. The program started in 2012 and this year well over \$4,000,000 of food will be recovered in this program. There are eleven depots throughout the city and people can receive unlimited produce six days per week and it is open on Saturday. In 2015, they started to operate in a 6,000-square foot warehouse. The recent donation of \$2,000 to Loaves and Fishes will access additional storage by using space previously unused with their 26-foot-high warehouse. The money will be used for additional racking and an upgrade to the Forklift. In Nanaimo, 50 other societies access the food

bank. How can individual Rotarians support the society? – you can drop all recycling bottles off at any one of their depots or buy Hockey Tickets for the Hockey Game scheduled in February. **Doug Cowling** thanked Peter for the update.

Following this quick and informative presentation, **Jane Curry** asked **Brent Stetar** to introduce other Guests and Visiting Rotarians. Guests- **Brent Barootes** introduced **Barbara Dobbyn** and **Joan Ryan** introduced our current MBA intern **Yoshiko Ohashi**.

Program Notes For December 15, 2017

The Executive Director of Boys and Girls Club, Central Vancouver Island (BGCCVI), **Ian Kalina**, was introduced by **Frank Shoemaker**. Mr. Kalina has had an accomplished career leading various humanitarian organizations over the last 25 years. He has held his current position with the BGCCVI for 13 years. Mr. Kalina has held a number of executive positions throughout British Columbia, and sits on councils with the United Way and Child Youth Committee, among others. He brought a goal of creating mergers for capacity to his role.

Today's program outlined the history, significance, activities, and future plans of the BGCCVI. The club has been in existence on Vancouver Island since 1971, with 13 locations on the Island. Last year, 1896 volunteer hours were amassed by club supporters. Rotary is one of these supporters. A recent event of importance was Lieutenant Governor Judith Guichon's opening of a new library for the Write2Read program at the local Boys and Girls Club on 5th Street. Several representatives from our club attended the opening.

The 4 goals of the Boys and Girls Club are to:

- 1. Provide high quality community services
- 2. Build a strong community
- 3. Build strategic partnerships, and
- 4. Grow their services

Within the mid-island region, the club has been very successful building partnerships with Nanaimo Aboriginal Centre, Metis Nation, Loaves and Fishes, Haven Society, and the City of Nanaimo. They recently partnered with the Town of Ladysmith to build a \$5.4 Million campus of Community Services, with an early years hub, and 89 licensed childcare spaces.

The club is the largest licensed childcare provider on Vancouver Island. They provide a safe space for children, youth, and parents to gain education and healthy socialization. Active participation is strongly encour-



aged. Programs and qualities supported by the club include: social and life skills, parenting education, homework help, self-sufficiency and independence, education support, financial literacy, cultural diversity, emotional regulation, a strong sense of self, and leadership.

Following the presentation, there were several questions from the club about future plans in town, cultural awareness, affordable housing partners, and cooperation between various groups. **Brenda Grice** thanked **Ian Kalina** on behalf of our club, and presented him with a pen, handmade by Allan Smith.



Rotarians served a full turkey dinner to about 160 students at Bayview Elementary school on Dec.21, 2017. Guenther Raedler provided funds, Thrifty Foods provided a discount, Barsby School cooked the turkeys and Mrs Riches cooked the vegetables.
