

The Club Annual General Meeting, followed by the Charitable Society Annual General Meeting were conducted following the Happy and Sad bucks and the card draws. Formal minutes of the AGM and C.S. AGM were recorded separately, but some points of note are as follows:

The minutes of the previous AGMs and the financial statements of both organisations were approved unanimously on a show of hands. The slate of officers proposed by the nominating committee to serve the Club and the Charitable Society was also approved unanimously on a show of hands. There were no nominations from the floor.

Business Meeting

Members were then asked to consider the Clubs financial status and budget.



Meal pricing options explained by Lynne Pankratz.

Club operations are consistently showing a deficit (projected at about \$7,300 this year) which is depleting our cash reserves. The cause is that the weekly cost of lunches exceeds what we pay. A committee of the board of directors has identified

five options for completely or partly eliminating the deficit.

The options are: \rightarrow



- Increasing the price of meals
- Increasing membership dues
- Reducing certain other club costs
- Allocating entertainment type meal costs to other budget lines
- Charging for installation

A sheet summarising the choices was distributed to those present and it was noted that a combination of options could work.

Members made several clarifying points:

John Heisterman wanted to confirm that some meal costs could be allocated to another budget line and that whatever we do would not impact the money we collect for helping others.



Brenda Grice asked about charging for installation and Joan Ryan responded that we charged in the past, but made it "free" because of low turnout.

Joan Ryan volunteered that of our total

annual dues of about C\$18,000, some US\$8,000 are remitted to Rotary International. She also pointed out that the first three options (meal prices, dues and charging certain expenses) would be tax deductible for those with their own businesses.



Janeane Coutu said that the committee developed their projections assuming at least one free meal for a visitor per weekly meeting. She also said that there has been no indication from the

hotel that they may increase their charges.

Members were asked to consider the options and to be prepared to come to a decision in January.

In conclusion: The meeting closed with one of President Bob's baloneys: "People who enjoy AGMs should not be in charge of anything".
