

All Rotarians sang a wonderful rendition of Happy Birthday to **Ross White** who is celebrating his birthday today. In addition, **Ross** and **Pam White** are celebrating their 55th wedding anniversary this week. As well, **John Marlow** is celebrating his 39<sup>th</sup> year in Rotary this week.

**Ross White** made a special Paul Harris presentation when he presented Paul Harris Fellowships to both of his sons; **Jeffery** and **Randell** for all their help and support with Rotary and the support they have given to their parents to allow them to participate in all the Rotary activities they have.

Ross explained that the first donation ever made to the Rotary Foundation by this club was \$26.50, and since this coming Rotary year Rotary Foundation will be celebrating its centennial year, Ross encouraged each of the club members to make their first donation to Rotary Foundation for this year \$26.50 to help kick off Debbie's year as president. The Rotary Foundation's signature project has been the eradication of Polio and for this year there has been only 3 incidents reported in the world. Rotary Foundation has funded many other projects around the world from clean



water projects, building of clean latrines to support of shelters for women and children around the world. Currently the club is working on obtaining a grant from Rotary International for 15 benches for Eden Gardens.

Speaking of Nanaimo Travellers Lodge, **President Debbie** read a letter thanking the club for the large \$50,000 donation received by the lodge to help fund their new premises on Northfield Road.

**Rotarian John Woychuck** is with the MBA program from VIU. Today he brought with him two MBA students – **Omar Karim** and **Dominik Beckers** – to talk about the MBA games. Omar, who grew up in Burnaby, has recently graduated but is staying in Nanaimo for the MBA



National competition in January. Dominik, who is from Hamburg, Germany, is delaying his graduation to also be part of this major national event. Omar and Dominik are thrilled to be here

to share their story and are impressed with Rotary and its commitment to the community. Their leadership strategy is to do everything with purpose or don't do it!

VIU MBA students first became involved with the BC MBA games about a year ago. Competing against UBC, SFU, TRU, and UVIC, the local team was triumphant and secured a first place finish! This secured them a position in the National MBA games where the team was awarded the top award for spirit and came in 4<sup>th</sup> overall. This is the first team a west coast university has achieved this result and a great boost to the VIU program and participants – they are the Best in the West!

In October 2016, the local campus will host the BC games with a total of 100 participants. Although it may look like there is a lot of fun and partying, the competition is all about teamwork, social networking and developing business plans. The drumming and dragon boating brought them together as teams and united the participants throughout the province into one family with one common goal. The theme for the October 2016 provincial competition is “A journey to New Heights.” They will be raising funds for childhood cancer. At previous events, they have raised funds for Autism.

### Connect. Inspire. Impact.

If this is not enough to do, Omar and Dominik are the key organizers for the Nationals that will be hosted at VIU in January 2017. This will involve about 700 participants from 20 universities throughout the country coming to our city and our Island to compete. The key components of the competition are Strategy, Entrepreneurship and Pecha Kucha (story telling with pictures). Cases are presented and teams have three hours to prepare and present.

### Today for Tomorrow.

The students noted that decisions today effect tomorrow. As part of the Truth and Reconciliation movement and in recognition of Canada's 150<sup>th</sup> year in confederation, the national convention will be involved in the Moose Hide campaign. This campaign is about taking a stance against violence towards women and children. Wearing the moose hide signifies your commitment to honour, respect and protect women and children. The local team is ecstatic to have the host of the Toronto Sportsnet program coming to the event as a keynote speaker. They plan to work with media and social media to highlight Nanaimo, the Island and the pro-



gram at VIU. The conference will be highlighting VIU facilities such as Milner Gardens and the Deep Bay Marine facility as well as highlighting our beautiful city. Although the competition involves spirit, sport and academic competition, it also forces participants to look at social issues rather than corporate issues. If the other participants are as intelligent and enthusiastic as Omar and Dominik, then our future is in very good hands.

**Guenter Raedler** let the speakers know that they are good for the community and VIU and as a business owner, he wanted to thank them for all they are doing. **Wendy Pratt** officially thanked the two. 
