


gave an interesting Rotary Minute. In the book, ABC's of Rotary, he read that meetings have always been run with members calling each other by their

Club Runner; A good way to communicate!

Our speaker last week was our own Janeane Coutu, who walked us through the way to use Rotary's ClubRunner as a means to communicate with fellow Rotarians with a series of tips. Janeane's tips were aimed at the



average club member to make it easy to use the **ClubRunner** system.

Tip No 1

You don't have to be logged in to read *COGS*. Just go to the website, click on the **Club Bulletin** heading on the main page and then click on the front page of the current *COGS*. Note that for privacy, members' names and contact details are printed on the hard copy we get at meetings, but are not available to the public on the web version of *COGS*.

Tip No 2

To login, go to the website <u>http://</u> rotarynanaimo.org and click on the **Member Login** button at the top right corner. Fill in your login name and password on the next screen. If you can't remember your login name or password (or both!), click on the link to retrieve login and/or reset password. Once you login, you can change your password yourself - a password should be at least 8 characters, including a number and of course something that you can easily remember.

Tip No 3

Keep your personal information (like email address and phone number) up to date as it gets used in the Roster and for mailings. To update your information, login and then go to the **Member Area**, **Admin** and then **Edit My Profile**



The Vancouver Island Conference Centre NANAIMO, BC which is the first on the list under **My ClubRunner**. Then follow the prompts and don't forget to save your changes.

Tip No 4

Change your password in **Edit My Profile**, under the **Settings** tab.

Tip No 5



To send an email, login and go to **the Member Area**, **Admin**, and then **Email Message Centre(New)** which is well down the list under **My ClubRunner**, and then select **Manage Emails**. To send an email you first hit **Compose New Message** and then select who will receive it from the lists of members provided. Enter your subject line and text for the message body as you would in any email. You have an option to send an attachment and to attaching the list of recipients (recommended). The final step is to chose to send immediately or later.

Tip No 6

If you want to read club documents, such as the constitution, bylaws, minutes of meetings, new member application form etc, you can find them under **My ClubRunner, View Club Documents**.

Tip No 7

You don't need to login to find out what is on next Friday - just click on the Calendar on the website home page.

Tip No 8

You can check your attendance re-

You can access our member directory on your smart phone. iPhone and Android users search *ClubRunner* at the App Store, and Blackberry users load <u>http://m.clubrunner.ca</u> in your browser. Enter your credentials to see such items as the club directory and members' pictures.
