Program Notes, June 8, 2018 by Denise Wittkofski Jason Bradley introduced the five exchange students who had the privilege to spend a year here in Nanaimo, including Beatriz Ferrari Pilla ("Bia"), Pinchen Lee ("Coco"), Alice Norrthon, Phoom Krit Bamrungsri and Alejandro Vera.

Bia and Coco were the speakers for our meeting, with



Bia starting first. Her presentation included pictures and tales about her family and small hometown in Brazil. Some highlights included:

- Rodeio the town's biggest and her favorite festival, which was taking place this week and she missed it!
- Her senior high school class gave a birthday party for their math teacher
- Her family and her dog, whom she missed because her host family only had cats
- The farm she grew up on
- Her favorite foods, which were not spicy like the ones she experienced when she first came to Canada
- How first experience washing clothes was a bit of a disaster, with water and soap pouring from the machine. She was living in the same house

with Coco at the time and was able to clean it all up before her host came home.

Coco then presented a background of her life Taiwan, which is an island (the "heart of Asia") like Vancouver Island. Highlights included:

- Her family Parents, sister and brother
- Her classmates

- Her country speaks Mandarin Chinese
- Taipei City is the capital
- She lives in Taichung City, population: 2M with a culture of 24/7 convenience
- Her favorite festival is New Year when family and friends celebrate a reunion dinner and kids get a red envelope with money
- Some famous Taiwanese include Ang Lee, who directed and won an Oscar for the movie "Life of Pi"
- Her favorite foods, including bubble tea
- The night market that she really missed especially the oyster omelet and "stinky" tofu
- For visitors, she recommended Kenting Taraoko,
 Palace Museum and Sun Lake City

Coco ended her presentation with a short tourist video about the beauty and rich heritage of Taiwan. She called



her fellow exchange students to the podium and showed pictures of their adventures, including:

- When Coco first met Bia at the Vancouver airport.
- Visits to Telegraph Cove--fishing salmon and seeing whales, and Hornby Island, which looked "magical"
- The Seabeck Conference
- California trip included Disneyland, Knotts Berry Farm, Beverly Hills and Hollywood.



Brent Barootes thanked the students and presented **Coco** and **Bia** each with pens made by one of our members. Coco then presented a banner to President Jane.
