### **Exchange Students Report**

Paul Geneau from Rotary North introduced our two inbound students. Paul has been the Youth Exchange Officer for both students for the past year.

Vemund Baksaas from Norway and Eakapoom (Man) Chaijit from Thailand have been in Nanaimo for the past 10 months.



Vemund attended Dover Bay High School and Man attended Wellington High School. Now that they have become proficient in English, they came to tell us more about their country and their families before they go home.

Vemund showed us a picture of 50 Norwegian Rotary Exchange students who all came to either North or South America for the past year. It makes for an impressive group.

Vemund is 18 years old and has a twin brother plus two other siblings, a brother of 26 and a sister of 23. Both his older siblings have done a lot of travel-



ling. The bother has visited several countries including Africa three times and one of those times was for nine months. He also came to Canada to visit Vemund a few months ago. His sister was on a six month student exchange to Australia. His twin brother is a media photoshopping artist who has already won some prestigious awards. (No underachievers in that family!) His father is an engineer with transport ships and his mother works with elementary school children.

In Norway, you can choose your profession after grade 10. He therefore already started studying electrical engineering before he came to Canada. When he returns, he will be entering his second year. It is a three year program. He made it sound like the last semester of the third year is one big party with many social events building up to Norwegian Constitution Day on May 17<sup>th</sup>. Vemund describes his life growing up with holidays on their own island and four week boat trips with this family. His hobbies are playing soccer, skate boarding and playing video games. He did a nine hour skate board trip to Sweden before coming on the exchange.



Ekkaboom or Man as he prefers to be called, started by thanking three of our members who hosted him this year. He spent the first 4 months with Charles Ramos and his family, and after a short stay with a member from another club in January, he came back to stay with Wahid Ali and his family and Henry Jiang and his family.

Man is an only child. His father is a Rotarian and his parents own a restaurant. The restaurant is attached to their home. He comes from a community not far from the Malaysian border. His school in Thailand has 4,000 students so attending Wellington School in Nanaimo was a bit of a culture shock. Man gave a lot of information about the history, customs and festivals of Thailand. Some interesting facts he shared: 95% of Thai people are Buddhist, there are 1400 islands and Thailand is the only South Asian Country which was never colonized. There is evidence of habitants going back 20,000 years. He showed many pictures which showed the beauty of this county. It

is no wonder, many North Americans make it their sun destination in the winter.

Joan Ryan thanked the speakers.
