



Classification Talks: Fay Laing & Henry Jiang

By Janeane Coutu Fay Laing was born in North Battleford, Saskatchewan and moved to Langley at the age of sixteen to live



with her grandma and aunt. (And she can honestly say, she never wanted to return to Saskatchewan.)

Fay has had a varied career in real estate over the years, but her first job was at the Surrey Credit

Union in Cloverdale. In 1983 she worked for Jack Poole, a major developer in the province of BC who was also involved in getting the Olympics to

Vancouver.

A career spanning 32 years in real estate has led Fay from Winnipeg to Victoria, although most of it was in Vancouver, and the last 8 years on Vancouver Island. Much of her work has been with new development and redevelopment of existing shopping centers. (We met Fay through our partnership with Nanaimo North Town Centre for our book sale.) She will be retiring at the end of June and then embarking on a 6month travelling tour with her husband, David. One of their first stops will be northern Italy to visit her son, daughterin-law and two grandchildren.

Fay has studied marketing, accounting, human resources and business management at the post-secondary level. In 1999 she completed a degree in garden design at UBC and went on to work at the VanDusen Botanical Gardens in Vancouver, becoming a Master Gardener.

In 2005, Fay and her husband purchased an 1891-built Victorian home in downtown Nanaimo as a restoration project and they have been working on it ever since – and loving every minute of it. They are proud of their home and gardens.

Up until the last year the couple owned and sailed a 32' boat around the Gulf Islands and Strait of Georgia. They have done lots of travel and enjoy the experience of different cultures and environments, but also love Nanaimo and consider it a special place to live.

Fay is looking forward to getting involved in the club after her sabbatical to travel, and is thankful for the opportunity to join Rotary.

Shan "Henry" Jiang calls Oingdao in China's eastern Shandong province his home city. It is a city of skyscrapers, parks and beaches bordering the Yellow Sea. Twenty years



ago the new downtown was farmland, now it is a modern city of 3.6m people, 8m in general area. Called China's Sailing City, it has hosted the regattas of the Olympic Games and the Volvo Ocean Race. Home to the longest sea bridge stretching 34km, they also have the 3rd longest undersea tunnel of 3.95km underwater, 7.8km in total length.

Shan means mountain in Chinese and Jiang means river. His English name of **Henry** was given to him 25 years ago while attending school in North America, studying finance and economics. His major was international trade. Henry was born in NE China, about 8000 km away from his home city. His father was a projectionist in the movie theatre (naturally he grew up with a love of movies), his mother a pharmacist. Henry is married to Alice

and they have one son.

After working 16 years in the biggest foreign trade company in China, he set up his own company in 2006 exporting kids clothing and products. These are fashionable products and are upper middle grade licensed products like Disney and Hello Kitty – that is how they survive. Customers include Sears, Target, Walmart, Costco, Toys-R -Us, Old Navy to name a few. Workers earn \$500 USD/month but his company is still competitive to Vietnam and Cambodia (where workers earn 1/10th of that) due to work efficiency, upstream supply chain and experienced workers.

Henry got to know Rotary from the fall book sale where he met Susan Gerrand. His first book purchase was a 1990 calendar of Norman Rockwell paintings. He enjoyed reading our 75th year history book and quoted from Paul Harris – "This is a changing world and we must be prepared to change with it. The story of Rotary will have to be written again and again."

Henry commented that new members bring something new to each club and he is glad to be part of ours. He hopes to host anyone interested in his home city of Qingdao, he knows China and East Asia very well due to his business travels. (Lila suggests getting a travel club together with Henry as our guide!)

President Bob Wilson thanked both of our speakers for excellent presentations, commented that you always learn something not expected during a new member talk. Each were gifted with a hand-crafted pen to mark the occasion.
