

#### **Meeting Notes for Friday 23 February 2018**

There were no visiting Rotarians.

#### **Announcements and Notices of Motions**



Speaking on behalf of the Community Grants Committee, **Susie Stephens** introduced four notices of motions:

• To donate \$10,000 to the **Nanai-mo Hospice** Society to help fund a pilot project known as the Griefmobile. This would offer bereavement services to families and others unable

to visit the Hospice and possibly on site services at crisis and disaster locations.

- To donate \$4,000 to the **Nanaimo Ladysmith Schools Foundation** for four \$1,000 annual awards in the current academic year. Consideration is to be given to naming one or more awards in honour of recently deceased Rotarians.
- To donate \$2,000 to the John Barsby School First Nations Alternative Program. This is a new school based alternative learning program for students in grades 8-10. The objective is to re-engage students in their own educational futures and catch them before they drop out.
- To donate \$7,000 in support of **Culture Days**April 17-20 at the Big House. The event will be hosted for some 700 aboriginal and non-aboriginal pupils and staff by grades 4 and 5 from Bayview School. Fairview, Gabriola and Qwam Qwum schools will also participate.

The motions will be presented and voted on at the meeting on March 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### Program Notes for Friday 23 February 2018 Rotary Foundation and Paul Harris Awards

John Salem as chair of the Foundation Committee opened the program by noting that The Foundation has been the cornerstone of Rotary International since the earliest days. However it really increased in scope and effectiveness with the Polio Plus program and with the partnership with the Gates Foundation.

The Rotary Foundation has received the highest rating among charities nine years in a row. Also 91% of funds are devoted to projects and programs. CNN ranks the Rotary Foundation fifth out of ten top charities worldwide.

John showed two short videos illustrating the scope and the reach of Foundation projects and programs.

**Frank Shoemaker** spoke about his experience the previous weekend attending the RI President's Conference on Environmental Sustainability and Peace in Vancouver, It was attended by over 800 delegates and was one of six being held around the world.

Frank said he was amazed at the number and variety of Foundation supported projects showcased at the conference. The number was overwhelming. He cited a few: the wheelchair foundation, hydro lawn rollers for transporting water, shelter box, peacebuilders training in Africa, cleaning rivers, solar power electrification of sewage treatment and trees Canada.

The keynote speaker was **David Suzuki** who emphasised taking care of the atmosphere and pointed out that humans are the only species to contemplate the future. There was a lot to take in with over 40 speakers plus breakout sessions, so Frank focused the remainder of his talk on Rotary Peace Fellows (of which he knew little before the conference).

There are about 4,000 Peace Fellows today and RI is



adding about 100 per year. They study at one of seven RI designated universities for a minimum of three months. RI is considering expanding the annual number of new Fellows. Frank met several Fellows and was highly impressed. They seem to be mostly working in international NGOs or think tanks. Frank had a strong sense that they are indeed making a difference in the world.
