# VIU Dental Program

John Heisterman introduced Marianne Roden. She was



born in Chilliwack and spent most of her life in Nanaimo. Marianne is part of the dental hygiene and dental assistant teaching programs at VIU. She spoke about the dental school helping disadvantaged children in the community.

Marianne opened by drawing parallels between her dental program work in the com-

munity and that of Rotary: both are focused on schools in the south end of Nanaimo.

In Nanaimo 27.7% of kids are brought up in poverty. In many cases the parent(s) is working full time and has very little time to look after the children. Often the children must prepare lunch from whatever they can find and get them-

selves off to school. Brushing teeth is not top of mind for these young folk and also they have no idea about sensible nutrition. The VIU dental program is doing its part to help

break the cycle of poverty by teaching aural hygiene, providing dental care and giving nutritional instruction. Before exposure to the program many kids do not own a tooth brush and many more do not know how to use one.

Research has shown that oral health is a necessary ingredient of pride, selfworth and betterment. VIU is partnering with kids in disadvantaged areas to promote oral health and so help

them break out of poverty. The interventions with the kids takes place at VIU in the school of dentistry and a by-product never occurred to him that their is that it opens the children's eyes to the possibilities of attending VIU in the future (with help from scholarships, etc.). It is also a great opportunity to introduce the dental program students to the importance of service to the community.

The VIU dental program is active in the schools in the south end of the City: John Barsby, Park Avenue, Bayview, Georgia Avenue and Brechin. There is a special Skills for Life program for kids with learning disabilities at John Barsby School. Oral health and nutrition are integrated with such activities as learning to ride a bike, learning to cook and basic personal banking.

The dental program started last year at Brechin School which is on the border between the south end and north end schools. The school neighbourhood has a high proportion of rental properties and First Nations people living off reserve. The dental students found a very high level of neglect among their young patients. The program there embraces grades 4 to 7 and involves bussing to VIU, partnering with a dental hygiene or dental assistant student, cleaning, instruction in oral care and nutrition, examination by a dentist and the children are sent home with oral health aids. Only 34 patients partici-



pated last year (probably for a lack of understanding) but a full 50 have been promised for 2017.

Marianne said their program in south end schools costs \$20 per child over and above those costs covered by the province or VIU and she suggested that in future Rotary should consider partnering with VIU in this very worthwhile project.

In thanking Marianne and presenting her with a handmade Rotary pen,

Dave Hammond admitted that it might be children who do not know how to clean their teeth. It is very important for our collective future to fix this problem among our poor residents: remember that aural hygiene leads to increased self-confidence and potential.
