

Charles Ramos handed our printed versions of the




existing and proposed revised constitution and bylaws. He had also emailed them to members and requested that we review them before a vote is called. Charles will pres-

PROGRAM NOTES FOR MARCH 2, 2018

Today's program was given by club members Joan Ryan and Debbie Narver on club initiatives they chair; Joan's presentation discussed Youth Services and Debbie discussed Community Partnerships.

President **Jane Currie** introduced the speakers:

Both Joan and Debbie are past club presidents and Paul Harris Fellows. Joan joined the club in 2003, she likes to sing, and she is the district chair for Rotary youth services. Debbie joined the club in 2011 under a classification of Business Consulting; her expertise is in business strategic planning, and she put this skill to use in working with her committee.

Joan discussed the youth programs that Rotary supports.



There are two youth clubs: Interact for youth between 14-18 years or high school students and Rotaract for young adults between 18-30 years. Rotaractors are eligible for dual membership in a Rotary club, if they choose. The student exchange that the Nanaimo clubs participate in is or-

granized and overseen by the Youth Services committee. This program is highly-regarded for the long term effects of engaging young people with service projects early in life. Joan also discussed some of the administrative and youth protections in place through the program.

Debbie presented on the Community Partnerships com-



mittee. This group actively searches for community humanitarian issues that can be helped with volunteer time or donations of money from the club. Some of the recent projects overseen by the committee were the Vancouver Island Mental Health Society's (VIMHS's) purchase



and assembly of beds, and the homeless clothing drive. Clubmembers **Laurie Bienert** and **Mike Minhas** were key leaders for these events. Both of these were 'handson' projects in which many clubmembers participated. The VIMHS project received a matching grant from Rotary International, which allowed the committee a greater impact. Clubmember **Ross White** is a key player in the committee; he volunteered at the Christmas food bank last year and is a frequent participant in the hands-on



events. The committee is always searching for deserving projects. Many of the projects are eligible for matching grants which multiplies the help that can be given.

Following the presentations, there were several questions, comments and accolades by clubmembers. **Wendy Pratt** thanked Joan and Debbie.

Rotary Update: Book Sale Preparation

Members will be pleased to learn that we are well on the way preparing for another very successful Grand Semi-Annual Used Book Sale. The sale will run from Friday 13 to Sunday 22 April.

Donations of books are running ahead of last year at this time and the quality of the books is very high. Our regular volunteers are managing to keep up with the initial sorting, but we are still looking for volunteers to take ownership of a category and to sort books within it to make them more accessible for buyers. Nanaimo North Town Centre continues to allow us to use the "big room" for sorting and display of books and we think that this big airy room and layout helped make the buyers' experience and the last sale the best ever.

The sign-up sheets are posted for duties during the sale when it will be all hands on deck to get the job done. We expect all members to sign up together with family and friends to do their part in our most important fund raising endeavor.

As of Tuesday, March 6 we have 50 volunteers signed up, 21 of those are spouses or friends such as Altrusa.
