



Major Donation to Travellers Lodge Eden Gardens

On behalf of the Community Grants committee, **Bob**Fenty made a motion that the club donate \$50,000 this year with the intention of another \$50,000 next year if approved by next year's Board to the *Nanaimo Travellers Lodge*Eden Garden project. The motion was seconded by Lucie Gosselin and after some discussion the motion was carried unanimously.

Nanaimo Travellers Lodge Eden Garden Project

Bob Fenty of the Community Grants committee chaired the discussion on the proposed recommendation to the club to make a donation of \$50,000 this year to the *Nanaimo Travellers Lodge Eden Garden project* with a further recommended donation of an additional \$50,000 in next Rotary year. **Robert Grose** was in attendance to represent the Travellers Lodge Board.

The club was provided with detailed reasoning for both the amount of the donation and the recommendation.

Discussion centered on the naming rights for the donation, several suggestions were made such as (a) the Front entrance garden with a Rotary Wheel on a stand with the history of Rotary's involvement in the Nanaimo Travellers Lodge (b) naming of one of the six communities which would be in the atrium of the community and (c) a recognition wall. There were at least three naming opportunities.

Dave Connelly mentioned that the downtown Rotarians have been involved in Nanaimo Travellers Lodge for over 20 years. Rotarians have contributed somewhere between 85,000 to 100,000 volunteer hours over the years.





Nanaimo Travellers Lodge helps elders with dementia to live as fully as possible and enjoy their live. The new facility will embrace the Eden alternative philosophy for care which is people centered and allows smaller groups of residents feel that they are in a neighborhood. It also provides for better care. This philosophy is setting the standard for dementia care in Canada. Of over 33,000 facilities in Canada only 4 have achieved level 2 standard of Eden care. The fund raising was necessary to maintain the standards of Eden care and to reduce the rooms in each neighborhood from the 16 room standard to the 11 rooms neighborhood which will better maintain the concept. The motion was carried.

The new facility is opening on April 27, 2017 and \$1.5 million needs to be raised to open the doors by next April.
