Ken Hammer of the Nanaimo Daybreak club introduced our guest speaker, Senyo Agbedra Yaw of Sunyani Ghana. Senyo began his talk by extending thanks on behalf of

the **Sunyani Municipality** for all the humanitarian projects the five Rotary

clubs of
Nanaimo/
Lantzville have
undertaken since
2007 to a total of
\$235,000 USD.
He highlighted
some of the key
projects in a
slideshow presentation detailing
the project
scope, cost and
photo's of the
results.

1) Sunyani

Assembly Municipal School – purchase or computers, textbooks, storage cupboards, teaching aids, basic health and sanitation – to the tune of \$21,100.

- 2) *Korkors Medical Centre Orphanage* purchase PC, mosquito nets and build mechanized Borehole (well) for clean water \$12,000
- 3) *Mosquito Nets* in Sunyani Municipal & Regional Hospitals for pregnant women \$2000
- 4) *Security Fence Wall* and gate post at Sunyani Municipal Assembly Primary School \$23,000
- 5) *12-unit Toilet Facilities* at the primary school \$38,000
- 6) *Bore Hole (well)*, 24-unit toilet facility, and outdoor wash station at Bosama Market \$54,000
- 7) **Abesim Library Books** and furnishings \$20,500
- 8) *Refurbish and Furnishings* for Korkors Charity Orphanage Techiman \$38,000

New projects the Rotary Clubs in Ghana are looking at include improvements to other schools; toilet facilities, fence wall, and roofing.

The delegates from Ghana are here in Nanaimo to...

- Strengthen long standing relationship
- Speak to the Regional District of Nanaimo
- Raise money for malaria nets
- Have Maggie continue to send students to Ghana
- Inform all 5 clubs on the old & new projects and its impacts on the people of Sunyani.

Why the interest in Sunyani, Ghana?

- Impact of the projects on the people of Sunyani
- Sustainability of the old projects
- It has also help reduce poverty levels
- High rate of girl child in schools
- Security for the school Kids.
- Reduction of all forms of water born disease
- Reduction of child mortality and has improved health in Sunyani.

Senyo concluded his presentation by telling us that the **Rotary Club of Sun-**

vani Central will continue to undertake many humanitarian projects with its international partners. Their objective is to do good in the World and bring smiles onto the faces of the deprived people in their poor communities. He wished to take this opportunity to call on


all and sundry to join forces with Rotary so that together we bring solace to the hopeless and peace in the world. Come and do Rotary work because **Rotary is good.**

JUNE IS ROTARY FELLOWSHIP MONTH

Friendship Agreement is signed between the City of Nanaimo and the City of Sunyani

Carey McIver explained that eight months ago, a group started to meet on a weekly basis to review the idea of the two cities entering into a Friendship Agreement. The meetings included representatives from the City, the RDN and VIU and entailed close communication with those in Ghana.

Some background information: In 2005 the first steps were taken by the RDN to work with the City of Sunyani around waste management strategies. This grew to include partnerships with all five Rotary clubs and Vancouver Island University. Over the years, \$235,000 has been spent on projects in Sunyani that have included sanitation, waste management, education, libraries and clean water projects.

Ken Hammer and Mayor John Ruttan began the celebration acknowledging the work that has been done over the past ten years. Senyo Agbedra Yaw, as acting Mayor of his city, and our Mayor then spoke about the great work that has been done and that this friendship between the cities will lead to an ongoing relationship that will benefit all concerned. Mayor Ruttan presented Senyo with some pictures and a flag of Nanaimo, and Senyo reciprocated with presenting a flag of Ghana to our Mayor. The two then signed the official Friendship Agreement.

Senyo spoke about how honored he is to be part of this special day and thanked us for taking an interest in his community. The work done by Rotary, VIU and the RDN have improved the lives of the citizens and improved the livelihood of those in the community. This is also a great opportunity for all to share cultures and goals.
