
Yvan Gosselin gave us an update on the Health of the Club with Yvan not aware of any club members who are having any health issues.

Speaker Notes for Friday 10 November 2017 The Nanaimo Military Museum by Brian McFadden

Mikel Knutsson introduced the speaker, Brian McFadden who gave a short history of the Museum before taking us on a guided tour. Brian served in the Canadian Navy in the post WW2 era. He joined Rotary in Kelowna in 1985 and transferred to Nanaimo in 1996. He has been a member of the Lantzville Club since 2004 and a volunteer at the Museum since 1998. He became a director of the Museum in 2005. He is currently vice president responsible for publicity and media relations. He continues to volunteer as a Museum staff person.

The Museum began in 1985 as a single storefront located in and donated by what was then known as

Rutherford Mall (now Nanaimo North Town Centre). The Museum soon grew through donations of memorabilia and expanded to three storefronts. However in 2010 they were given notice to quit by the mall. Brian said that this was the best thing that could have happened to them. Fortunately they had already been searching for an alternative location and had been in discussions for some time with the City.

The Centennial Building had been vacant for two years and was in bad condition. Following various discussions and an in camera presentation to Council, the City agreed to lease the building to the Museum. It took about a year to clean up and repair the building and bring it up to code. The City provided a new roof together with other miscellaneous support, while the interior was refurbished and painted by the volunteers with material support from local corporate sponsors.

The Museum is a registered non-profit society funded from a provincial grant and individual donations.



There are thirty five all volunteer staff.

The Military Museum is recognized by Tourism BC and by the City of Nanaimo as a tourist destination. They have had over 20,000 visitors since opening in 2010. Brian said that they have experienced a huge increase in visits this year. Group youth tours are common, particularly close to Remembrance Day. The tour Brian gave our group was a quality experience and it was easy to understand why the Museum is recognized as a tourist destination.

Brain closed by reminding us that it is important to honour Canada's military history and our veterans.



Brent Barootes thanked Brian for his informative introductory talk about the Museum and for subsequently guiding us through the exhibits. Brent presented Brian personally with Rotary pen and a cheque for \$200 for the Museum as an honorarium.

The Rotarains then walked to the Military Museum to partake in the tour led by Brian McFadden. He explained the significance of each display and covered the highlights of some of the more complex displays,



such as the explanations of Deppe and Normandy. Displays included posters explaining some of the significant missions of the Canadian Armed Forces, weapons from muskets to modern, medals, manequins dressed in the uniforms used through the different wars and peace keeping missions and dioramas.



Brian was not only very knowledgeable, but also interesting to listen to, making the tour a great experience.
