Bob Patrick gave happy bucks that he has now reduced to part-time work, but sad bucks that he will need to address his wife's to-do list.


Wendy Pratt gave \$5 to self-fine herself for a missing nametag, and also kudos to the book sale committee.

"Tour de Rock" Raises \$1.2M for Cops for Cancer

Our speaker today was **Hillary Eastmure** has joined us today to tell us about her recent experience with *Cops for Cancer* and her recent ride on Vancouver Island.



Hillary was introduced by **Bob Patrick** who told us that **Hillary** worked at *Coast FM* and joined the team as a media representative. Her training included 7 months of intensive riding in preparation for her island adventure which correlates to 2000 km of riding.

Hillary's big ride took place on October 2nd with the **Tour de Rock** from one end of the island to the other and she noted that they rose \$1.2m for childhood

cancer research. She noted that only 2% of all cancer research money goes to children's cancer research and that the *Tour de Rock* has been going now for 18 years.

Hillary decided that 2015 was going to be her year for stepping out of her comfort zone and the year started with a Polar Bear swim on New Year's Day and included her *Tour De Rock* experience. Her riding started with the traditional shaving of her hair in support of the young girl she was riding for and she found so many times when she was bone tired that she found the needed energy to carry on with the support of the other riders.

She noted that one of the other riders in her group had a neck brace placed around his neck due to an injury one day prior to the start of a 120 km ride.

Some of the places visited during the ride included Rath-



trevor Beach in Parksville, a school in Woss, which raised \$300. Sayward where a lady donated a crocheted boat for the kids to play with when they attended the kids camp. The

boat took her 6 month to crochet. Other locations visited included a school in Campbell River where the kids were very excited, Shawnigan Lake School, and at one location a young 8 year old girl had Hillary share her head and raised \$300 for the ride in 30 seconds.

The summit in Port Alberni and the summit on the way to Ucluelet / Tofino were grueling for the group and they celebrated getting to the summits by large amount of hugging but the riders.

One thing our speaker learned during her training and subsequent ride was always find someone to hug and don't be afraid to cry; it's good for you. It releases your emotions.

In Sayward, the community presented a cheque to the Rock for \$10,500. And the Port McNeil Rotary Club cooked up steak dinners for the riders.

In Port Hardy a 14 year old boy with a rare form of brain cancer has the community rally around him to support the *Tour De Rock*. His sister also donated her hair. A church in Union Bay made cookies for the riders by the ladies of the church.

Hillary noted that they trained on Calder Hill in Nanaimo and she said this was simply a steep and nasty hill to ride up. She said that there is a valley for every hill in life that

IN MEMORIAM Rotarian Dr. Herbert C. Welch

May 9,1925 — October 19, 2015



We are saddened to hear of the passing of long-time member of our Rotary Club, Herb Welch, who has served in many capacities in our club including President in 1983-84. Herb joined our club in 1960, and is a Paul Harris Fellow and an Honorary Rotarian.

Herb came to Nanaimo in 1954 as a GP and then moved his family to Rochester, NY where he specialized in internal medicine, returning to Nanaimo in that capacity in 1959.

Along with Rotary, Herb supported the Nanaimo Hospital Society, the Internal Medicine Society of North America, Probus, the Port Theatre and the Nanaimo City Planning Commission.
