

Motions:

Carey MacIver had presented a Notice of Motion on behalf of the International Service Committee two weeks ago that the Rotary Club of Nanaimo donate \$5,000 to



the Oceanside Rotary Club towards the approved 5-Club Global Grant project to update and repair three schools in Sunyani, Ghana. Ross White seconded the motion and it was carried by the majority vote of the Club members present.

Rotary Minute:

Pres Bob called on **Brenda Grice** to provide the Club with more information for World Polio Day. Brenda reminded us that the main focus of The Rotary Foundation is the fight against polio worldwide, with the goal to eradicate it for good. Our club has a proud history of supporting the Foundation with over \$280,000 in total contributions over the years.

In 1985, over 30,000 children were paralyzed worldwide by polio annually. By 2000, the number of countries with active cases of polio was 20. Today, thanks to National Immunization Days, polio is all but eradicated accept in areas that are politically unstable, although immunizations in these areas are still quietly happening in association with "health camps" set up by the World Health Organization. Polio is still stalking children in poverty and conflict stricken areas and the risk is that refugees from these areas could cross border and re-infect locations where the disease had previously been eradicated.

Brenda thanked all members of the Club that have generously donated to the Foundation and with President Bob welcomed three of our Club members to the Paul Harris Society: Ross White, Dave Connolly, and Frank Shoemaker. The presentation of the Paul Harris Fellow is the Foundation's way of expressing its appreciation for a substantial contribution to its humanitarian and educational programs and is named after our founder. Paul Harris.

While there will be a more formal presentation at a later date, because he will be away, Ross White was presented with a certificate welcoming him to the Paul Harris Society.

Club Assembly

The 2014-2015 club budget was reviewed, with printouts provided to each table. A summary of the items discussed by the membership was as follows:

Meal subsidy: This line item contains the weekly subsidy provided to members, the annual joint 5-club meeting meal costs, the guest lunches, and *Rotaractors* meals when they attend a meeting. The weekly subsidy is substantial as meal cost is \$22, while \$20 is charged at the door. A subcommittee headed by **Lila Tanner** is being formed to explore the club's options to recover this moving forward.

Janeane Coutu noted that an overall budget deficit is caused by the meal costs, and she questioned the wisdom of passing a budget that shows a deficit.

Book Sale: The book sale income and expenditures were reviewed. This is our largest single income generator and continues to be more productive year by year. The logistical organization has now reached a phenomenally efficient level, and support from the Nanaimo North Town Centre is excellent.

Centennial Committee: \$30,000 from club-raised funds is earmarked for the Centennial project account each year. Joan Ryan and Dave Hammond are heading this committee, which will soon meet to discuss the project options.

<u>Membership</u>

Douglas Anderson rose to present a strategy to increase membership. However, due to low attendance, the exercise planned for this item has been rescheduled for Nov. 14th, in order to have a more complete discussion with the full club. Douglas summa-



rized the issues around membership and the intent of the planned exercise. Our club membership was near 100 members 10 years ago, and has remained fairly steady at around 60 members for the last 4-5 years. There are generally three areas in which Rotarian membership is lost: Death, relocation, and dissatisfaction. The first two are inevitable, but the third can be addressed, and it may be possible to retain members
