PROGRAM NOTES - JOURNEY TO SKETCH INDIABy: Wayne Anderson


Our speaker was introduced by **President Charles**. **Brenda Grice** and **Douglas Anderson**, both members of our Rotary club were to be our speakers today, however, Brenda was not feeling well, and so Douglas made

their presentation on his own. Douglas started off by explaining that Brenda and he went with their friends **Penny** and **Jan** to sketch Japan in 2016. They had a wonderful time and then planned to go to India in 2017 however that trip did not happen and through their art trainer, **Suzanne Northcote**, they decided to do two art based

The trip started in GOA, India with **Suzanne**, **Penny**, and **Jan** where they spent 10 days taking art courses in an ashram and when they weren't sketching they were out sight-seeing. The ashram provided all of their food which was local, fresh and in season and it also provided a yoga instructor. Douglas showed photos of their journey and a dialogue for each as he continued through the talk. He went on to say that the buildings decay and rot very quickly due to the heat and humidity due to the sub-tropical climate. He had photos of buildings a couple of years old which were obviously in disrepair. Fifty percent of the vehicle traffic is two wheeled, scooters, pedal bikes and motor bikes are a popular means of transportation and there is a constant honk-



ing of horns on every road. They did feel safe in their travels, took a two hour river cruise with crocodiles visible in the water, and were able from their ashram to watch the beautiful sun set over the Arabian Sea.

From GOA they traveled to the Rajasthan province in India, they saw the fringes of Delhi and Douglas commented that they was a lot of smog in the air, the air quality was bad mostly caused by fine dust. The terrain

in the area is basically flat but then suddenly a mountain would appear for no apparent reason. In Jaipur they visited the Amber Palace, the principal tourist attraction, it was declared a UNESCO World Heritage site. The Palace is surrounded by its own 'great' wall. They were able to take photos of the activity of the locals that happen on the roof tops of adjacent buildings. Many of the buildings in the City were painted red for a visit by King George?

From Jaipur their group moved on to Bundi, India where they stayed in tents during their visit, everything went very well and overall, they had a wonderful vacation on their journey to sketch India.

Douglas was thanked for his presentation by President Charles and then he stayed after the meeting was over to show more photos and answer questions from the remaining Rotarians.
