

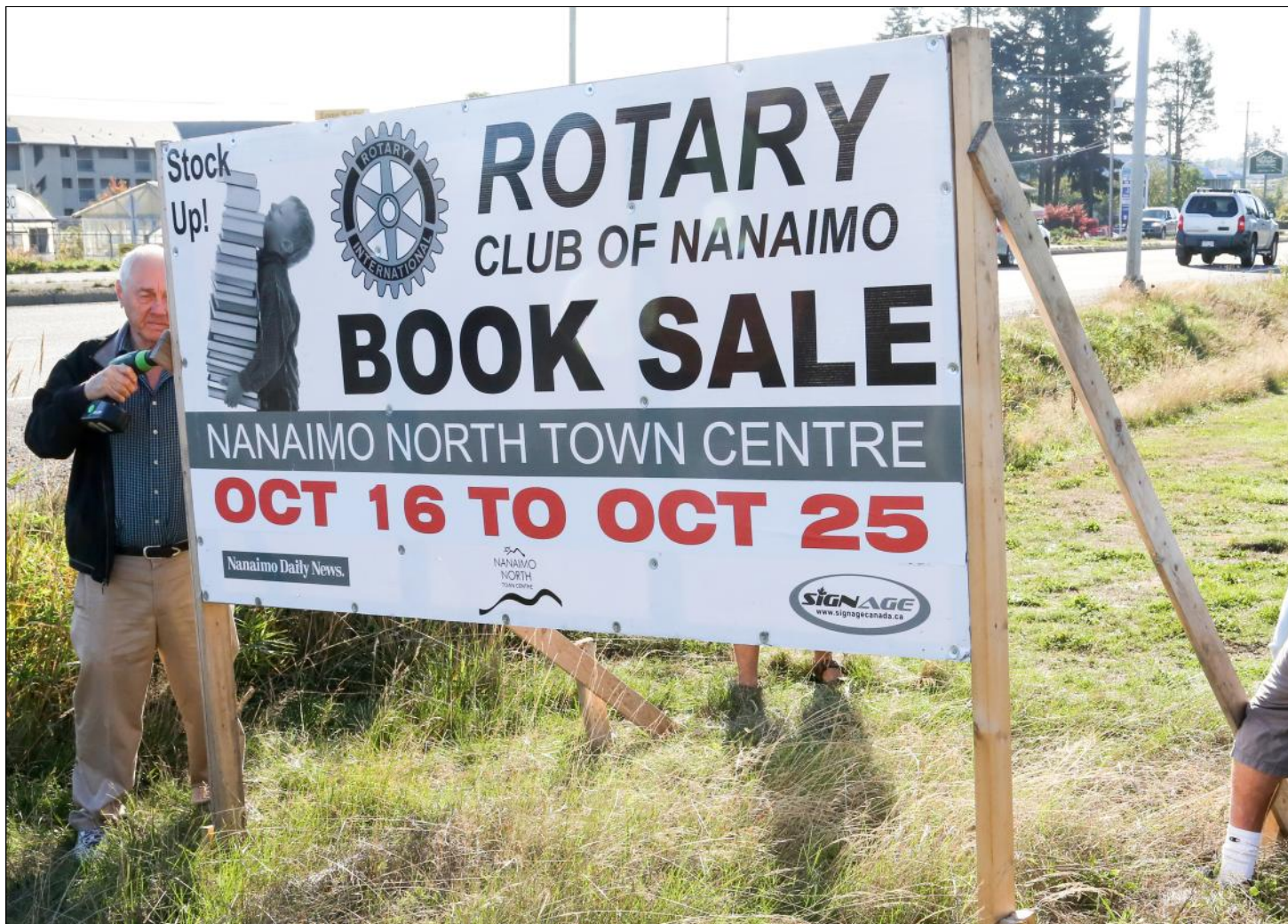

all enjoyed the meeting and continue to consider joining our club.

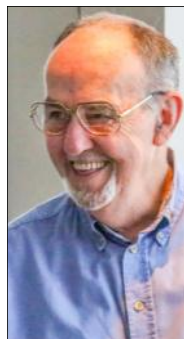

Iranian by birth, Canadian by choice

Our guest speaker today was club member **Moe Lessan** who was going to talk about his birth country, Iran. Moe was introduced by **Bruce Samson** who said that he listened to Moe's "Baby Talk" about a year ago and was fascinated by his previous talk and was looking forward to today's talk. Bruce said that after his 37 years in the military he can understand the fear people have of Middle Eastern countries but that Moe was a true example of the many good people that are from those countries.

Moe started his talk by saying more people are afraid of public speaking then death but he did not seem that way inclined and he has been involved in many media training courses in North America.

He said that it is very easy for North Americans to confuse Middle Eastern countries and traditions. Countries like Iran and Iraq are totally different in culture, politics and religion and pointed out the following example. People think curry is an Indian food where in reality it is a British food developed when Britain invaded India.

Iran borders many countries including Iraq, Turkey, Russia, Pakistan, India and Afghanistan.

Iran is the modern name for the country that was previously named Persia. Over 2500 years ago, Persia had a Charter of Rights and Freedom.



Iran is not an Islamic Country and the Country's main religion is Shia Muslim, with Sunni Muslims, Zoroastrians, Christians and Jews making up the difference.

Moe left Iran when he was 18 years old and travelled with others across the dessert in search of a new start and came to Canada with a Humanitarian Status. Moe says that he is Iranian by birth but Canadian by choice and denounced his Iranian Citizenship in 1992.

Moe said that Iran is not an oil rich country but is very rich in minerals including uranium, copper, gold and you can get temperature fluctuations from middle of summer temperatures to minus 10 degrees within a two hour drive. Iran also borders the Caspian Sea which produces great caviar.

The 1988 census showed Iran with a Population of 53.25 million people which today is about 70 million. The capital

Tehran has 12 million people.

Iran is an Islamic Republic on the Persian Gulf and has many historic landmarks including the 435m high Milard Tower with many ruins dating to the 6th century. The Golestan Palace in Tehran was the seat of the Qajar Dynasty from 1794-1925.

Dave Connolly thanked Moe for this great talk and presented him with the coveted wood pen made by him or club member **Al Smith**.

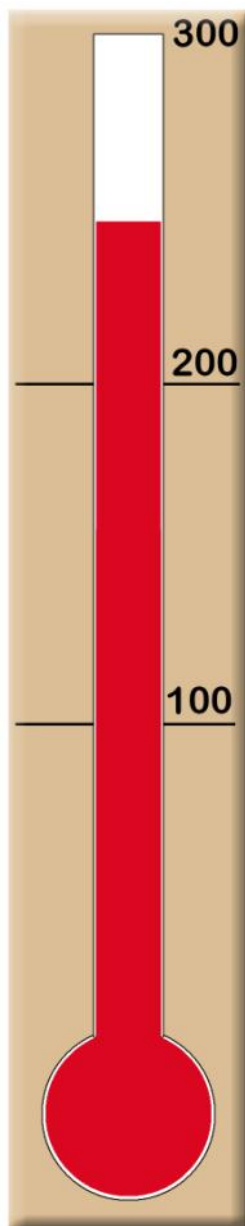
