A decent meal saves a starving child



Brief History

In 1998, 300 homeless children 5 to 7 years of age, who were begging in the streets, were gathered and housed. Now this home has grown to a large family of 535-children plus staff. These children have to be fed or they will suffer from severe malnutrition which could result in death. This facility has been reputed as a heavenly place in Najin City to many hungry homeless children.

Management

The home is operated entirely with private donations and managed independently. One Canadian gentleman has been in charge as an honorary director who is responsible for procuring foods at the China side and transporting foods by a truck to North Korea. No overhead cost is involved.



Current Jinancial Needs

The entire budget for the home is currently US\$ 6,900/month. This means a mere 40 cents per child per day. There is an urgent issue though. Recently another children's home within the city limits was completely burnt down. About 300 children are temporarily housed in a warehouse facility. Dr. Kim is asking for help to rebuild the home before the harsh winter sets in.
