
## ALASKA HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION STRATEGIC PLAN PRESENTED BY MARTI BUSCAGLIA

Marti Buscaglia has been the executive director of the Alaska State Commission for Human Rights since May 2016. Her background is in newspapers, but she has been an avid volunteer for Human Rights organizations her entire life.

Most recently, she was publisher of the *Fairbanks Daily News-Miner* and before that, publisher of the *Duluth News-Tribune* in Minnesota for five years. She was also vice president of sales and marketing at the *Anchorage Daily News*.

Marti has been a Rotarian for the past 14 years, including as a member of the Rotary Club of Fairbanks. She is one of the co-founders of the Duluth-Superior Eco Rotary Club, chartered in 2009, and served as its president for the first two years. She lives in Chugiak with her husband, Tim, and their three dogs.

The Alaska State Commission for Human Rights is the state agency tasked with enforcing the Alaska Human Rights Law. It consists of seven commissioners appointed by the governor and confirmed by the state legislature. The commission employs a staff and maintains an office in Anchorage. Its mission is to prevent discrimination.
