TODAY'S PROGRAM: OPERA FAIRBANKS PRESENTS "I PAGLIACCI"



Performers from Opera Fairbanks, to include conductor Gregory Buchalter, will perform selections from Opera Fairbanks' upcoming production of Leoncavallo's Pagliacci, among the most popular (tragic) operas of all time since its premiere in 1893. Along with Buchalter will be Jamila Hla Shwe, Anna Polum, Ta'u Pupu's, and SeungHyeon Baek.

Buchalter is the Artistic Director and conductor Opera Fairbanks, Opera Las Vegas, and Opera Camerata of Washington. In Fairbanks he has conducted L'Italiana in Algeri, Carmen, La Boheme, L'elisir d'amore, Don Giovanni, Tosca, La Cenerentola, and a Gala performance celebrating Alaska's 50th anniversary featuring Vivica Genaux. During his leadership with these

companies, he has brought in many internationally renowned singers including Paul Plishka, Sondra Radvanovsky, Francisco Casanova, Alessandra Marc, Cynthia Lawrence, Luana DeVol, Alexandra Deshorties, and Richard Bernstein. Maestro Buchalter is also an active symphonic conductor.

Opera Fairbanks is a 501c3 Alaska nonprofit corporation founded in December 2005. Its' first production was "A Touch of Opera" in the spring of 2007 at Pioneer Park Civic Theatre.

Opera Fairbanks' mission is to preserve and expand access to the operatic and vocal arts throughout the State of Alaska and beyond, it shall be the mission of OPERA FAIRBANKS to 1) expand and invigorate operatic and vocal arts performances; 2) provide educational opportunities relating to opera and vocal arts; 3) encourage the composition and performance of new works; 4) develop and promote joint productions between opera/vocal performance and other arts organizations; and 5) raise Alaska's standing as a performing arts tourism destination.
