ENGAGING NEW VOICES: STRONGER TOGETHER

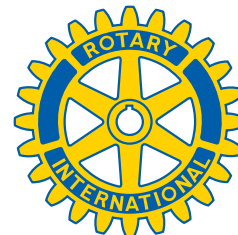
