Why Southside Belize City?

Home to 27,000 people, Southside Belize City is a community at a turning point:

- Highest Poverty Levels
- Lowest Literacy Rates
- Dysfunctional School Latrines
- Lack of Classroom Books
- Unusable School Libraries
- Little to no civic infrastructure to foster Community
- Adults who lack basic skills to find meaningful employment
- Lack of early childhood development supports for parents and children

Project Elements

Rebuild Libraries & Provide Classroom Resources

- Deliver 100 Classroom Libraries to students and teachers in schools most in need to foster literacy development.
- Renovate and restock the Central Library in 3 Southside Belize
 City schools to improve reading levels.



Provide Access to Effective Literacy Programs

- Establish 5 Permanent Sites for the Computer Assisted Literacy Program to help children and adults improve learn to read and improve their math skills.
- Offer Rhymes That Bind Parent and Child Learning Program to over 2,400 parents and children.



Improve Water & Sanitation for Children

 Renovate or Rebuild 2 school latrines to foster healthier schools, better learning and to prevent diseases and their transmission



Revitalize Infrastructure to Foster Community

- Build 4 Playgrounds to foster community and to provide a place for children to be children.
- Build a Rotary of Edmonton Park to provide a welcoming environment for citizens of Southside Belize City.



Partners

In Belize, the project partners include the Rotary Club of Belize City, the Rotary Club of Belize Sunrise, RESTORE Belize, the Ministry of Education Youth and Sport, and the Literacy Unit of MOEYS. In Edmonton, we are partnering with the District 5370 Playground Committee, the District 5370 Belize Literacy Program and the Adopt-A-School Initiative.
