

Official Rules and Logistical Notes

Teams of 2 - 4 are given a list of tasks to accomplish during a three hour timeframe (1:00 pm to 4:00 pm). Tasks involve collecting certain items, answering unique trivia and photographing the team with as many targets as possible. The name of the game is not so much speed but strategy as each task has a different point value allocated to it. Each team has to decide if it wants to go for a high volume of tasks or go for the higher valued tasks for more points. The winning team is the one with the greatest number of points at the end of the day!

The Object of the Game:

The object of the game is to...

- 1. Photograph your team members with as many **targets** on the list as you can.
- 2. Collect as many of the **items** as you can.
- 3. Answer as many of the **questions** as you can.

Tasks:

Targets:

The targets category consists your team of four being photographed with people, places, things or in situations. Remember that whenever the directions do not identify a specific number of teammates, the more team members, the better. In the event of a tie the winner will be determined by the number of team members in the photos.

The Interpretive section consists of a list of words or phrases that your team may interpret in any number of ways. Don't forget - creativity counts. A bonus will be given to the 3 most creative teams.

Take note that even though you are limited on how many photos can be submitted, nothing is prevent you from combining multiple targets into one photo.

Items:

The items category consists of items that you do not need to photograph but that the team needs to bring back to Home Base. We've tried to make most of the items free but a few you may need to spend a few loonies on if you choose to include them. I.e.... best garage sale find for a \$1. A bag will be provided to all members to hold most items being requested. All items will be returned to the team at the end of the event.

Questions:

Your team will probably want to take a break somewhere along the way for lunch or a break at a patio, so there is a sheet of questions that you can answer for points as well. Just as above, the more difficult the question, the more points are allocated to it.

Donations:

Teams can collect donations for Rotary's Purple Pinkie Campaign to eradicate Polio. It costs as little as \$1 to immunize two children from polio.

All proceeds will be matched by the Government of Canada at \$2 for every \$1 contributed to The Rotary Foundation (Canada). All of these proceeds will be donated to Polio Plus, and will be additionally matched 2 to 1 by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, making your \$1 now \$6. See more below.

Points will be awarded to the 3 teams that collect the most funds for polio eradication.

Points:

Each team will have a list of targets with the point values assigned. Point values are Pre-determined by the judge/s and range between 1 and 50 points per target with the more difficult targets allocated more points. Remember, you have roughly 4 hours, it may seem like a lot of time, but the time will go quickly.

Teams:

Teams of 2-4 are registered in advance. During the rally the whole team must stay together. Teams may lose points if they separate as most tasks involve pictures where the whole team is meant to be together.

Cameras and Photo Processing:

We are in the digital age so it is a safe bet that most people would have access to a digital camera or a smartphone device with a decent camera. We ask that you use a device that can utilize a SD\SDHC card. If you only have another format, please ensure that you have the proper computer USB cable to transfer the photos for the judging. Each team is limited to 25 photos. Ensure that only 25 photos are on the card by deleting unwanted ones. If there are more than 25 photos at judging time, only the first 25 will count. Once teams come back to home base, the pictures will be transferred to a laptop and judging will begin. A sheet will be provided to each team to validate what task is included in each photo. It is to each teams responsibility to ensure all tasks are properly itemized. Judges will do their best to count but some may be missed.

Damage or Harm:

Please take no risks to your personal safety during this hunt. Don't do anything illegal, damage any property or harm any animals or people in order to complete your mission. Remember that this is a fun event, yes there is a race element but please do not do anything to jeopardize your own or others personal safety.

Fun:

You are absolutely required to have fun while participating in this event.

Schedule of Events:

11:30 noon – Teams begin to gather at CMHA, 329 Pitt St. in the Parking lot.

12:00 to 1:00 pm – Review of rules and strategize

1:00 pm – The Rally begins!

4:00 pm – All teams must report back to CMHA. Late teams will be penalized.

4:30 pm to 5:30 pm – Judging, food and awarding of winners
