Keynote Speaker Biography

Wallis Harris was born in Montreal in 1935. He has been married to his high school sweetheart, Dorothy, for 55 years. Dorothy and Wally live in Mont Tremblant, Quebec.

After high school, Wally completed an apprenticeship program at Dominion Engineering while playing hockey for the Junior Montreal Canadians. During this time, he was offered the opportunity to turn professional and join Montreal's AHL affiliate in Buffalo. He chose instead to complete his apprenticeship and a training program to install electrical turbines in Pakistan.

While all this was going on, Wally found time to marry Dorothy and took a permanent job with an engineering company while playing Senior Hockey. It was during this period that Wally became interested in officiating. After 4 years officiating in Major Junior and Senior Hockey he was asked to join the staff of the NHL. Wally turned the NHL down twice before finally accepting.

Between 1963 and 1984, Wally officiated in more than 1000 games, including playoffs. Wally became Assistant Director of Officiating in 1985 where he remained until he retired in 2002. Wally has conducted officiating training camps in Switzerland, Italy, Austria and France.

Being a high energy man, while all this was going on, Wally also ran a successful steel distribution business covering Quebec and the Maritimes.

Incredibly he still had time on his hands to compete in kayak racing with the Lachine Canoe Club in 7 Canadian Championships and 5 North American Championships.

To this day Wally is still an 8 handicap golfer and skis 5 days a week.

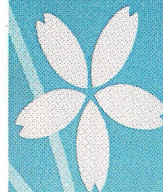
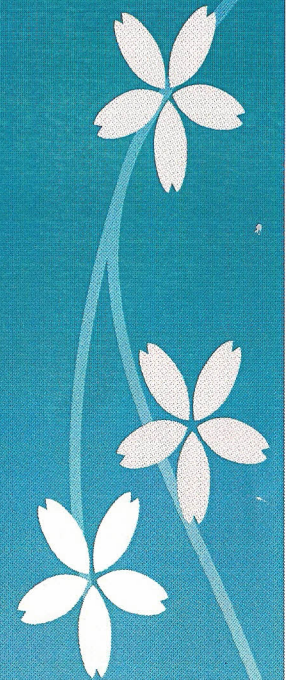
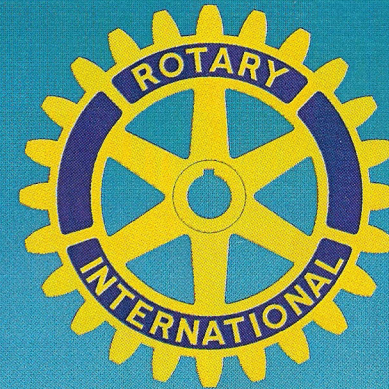


Star Spangled Banner
