# The meeting (32<sup>nd</sup> of the Rotary year) begins

Following the Anthem with **Rod Holmes** at the piano, and a Grace this week acknowledging the role of Rotary in society, **Brian Foster** recognized John Graham, Beth Kirkwood, Sandra Lanois-Bazinet, and our speaker, Birket Foster as our guests for the day. John was the guest of **Carol Bell Thompson** and the others came with our speaker. **Rod Holmes** provided the keyboard accompaniment to the Welcome Song. ### **General Announcements**

-Merv Letts shared with us the presentation he is making to other clubs to encourage their participation in both the Mums and Cash Calendar campaigns. Key points he will be making concerning the calendars are: the very positive role of outside partners, such as hockey clubs; their role in securing advertisers; and the opportunity for them to submit photos for consideration. As for Mums, he will invite other clubs to focus on sales and less on delivery as we will be looking for our own members to do multiple delivery trips in order to keep more of the proceeds within our Club. Mums delivery this year will take place between October 2nd and 6th.

-Bob Harrison spoke to the issue of this year's Rotary awards. Nominations are particularly sought for two awards that are for non-Rotarians. One is the Ruth Martin Award, which is intended for organizations or individuals who have provided significant "well-being" services over time. The other award would be to a member of a Rotarian's family- not the Rotarian him- or herself- who has provided services to the Rotary Club of West Ottawa itself which we should acknowledge. The closing date for these nominations, as for the others, is March 19. Bob also took the opportunity to refer to Merv's announcement on Mums and told us that his car was a Morris Minor, which would restrict his ability to help deliver Mums.

This will provide an opportunity for Club members and guests to recognise the community activities of the Club, and the potential networking opportunities which exist through Rotary membership.

# **Presentation:**

**Joe Redhead** introduced our speaker, Birket Foster, CEO and founder of MBFoster Associates, a software development company, and Chairman of Storm Internet Services, a regional Internet Service Provider in northern Canada. He had originally come to make his presentation at a meeting in late 2018, but a very spirited Club discussion had erupted at that meeting over the future of the Mums campaign and he had graciously agreed to postpone his talk until now. Birket is Past President of the Chesterville Rotary Club. Earlier in 2018, and in association with other Rotarians from the Chesterville and other Rotary Clubs, he began to plan the outlines of a generic scalable and repeatable project to provide drinking water and/or other infrastructure to First Nations communities and would now tell us how the planning is developing

Birket told us that the idea for the concept emerged from a high school reunion he had attended. He calls it Emergency Operation Things (EoT), which would embrace the provision of drinking water, wastewater handling, communications and power in remote communities, typically as a customized response to an emergency, but also as base infrastructure to pre-empt trouble. He explained the concept as a "shelter box on steroids" approach to development needs. RC Chesterville was interested and other Rotary clubs have also shown interest. Local involvement in the design of the system and training to ensure sustainability of operations would be imperative in every application.

Brisket clarified during the questions that followed that he is now developing an inventory of sites for development. Rotary funding is planned only for the needs assessment process. If properly done the assessment should unlock plan implementation funding from other sources. The planning as described by Birket, the proposed partners and the equipment being considered made an impressive sounding package. Joseph Redhead observed that the identification of promising sites should be weighted towards local communities that are motivated to assist.
