Program: Chris Burn- Climate change challenges for northern Canada

Greeted by **Marilyn Letts** and **Fred Sirotek** with **Frank Cranton** on Reception, meeting fee collected by **Doreen Ide** and **Fred Christie** selling Past President's Draw tickets. At noon President **Pardeep Ahluwalia** invited us to the buffet and at 12:30 he welcomed us to the forty-second meeting of the Rotary year. The national anthem (keyboard accompaniment by **Rod Holmes**) was followed by Grace delivered by **Lynda Flynn**.

Program Presentation

President Pardeep then passed the floor to **Jim Maxwell** to introduce our guest speaker. Dr Chris Burn is supervisor of Carleton University Northern Studies programs. His relationship with Carleton goes back to 1981 when he was studying towards a Phd in geology. Since then he has become recognized as a world authority on permafrost and has received many research grants and recognition by the Governor General. **Jim** noted that he and Chris have been members of the Royal Canadian Geographical Society for many years.

Dr Burn started by noting that the North is a small place in terms of human relationships, as is borne out by the close bonds forged between those who have done survey work there including some in attendance, such as **Jim Maxwell** and **Keith Fraser**, and the father of **Keith's** guest, Phyllis MacFarlane.

At present, about one third of Canada's land mass is frozen. Climate change may increase temperatures by almost 11 degrees celsius by 2100. From 1970 to the present, mean temperatures in Inuvik have already increased from minus 9.5 degrees to minus 6.5 degrees, a rate of increase that exceeds maximum forecast at the time that the Mackenzie Valley Pipeline project was being studied.

Climate change is normally seen as affecting flora and fauna but it also affects infrastructure spending. Dr Burn thinks we will need a succession of serious negative climatic situations to realize the gravity of the issues confronting us. An example is the Dempster Highway, which has contributed hugely to the development of the North West Territories. It was built over permafrost, and the ice that underlies much of the route of the highway is now melting. The rehabilitation costs of the Yukon sector of the road have increased from \$1.6 million to \$5.3 million per year since 2005.

Doug Heyland thanked Dr Burn for his presentation with a memento and informed him that the club would make a donation to End Polio Now to mark his presentation. Dr Burn was particularly pleased by the donation because polio had afflicted a close friend.
