Program presentation

Gaye Moffett then introduced our speaker, Patti-Kay Hamilton, who has written an award-winning book: *TRAPLINE TO DEADLINE*, *trading a skinning knife for a CBC microphone*. Her story was about her career with the CBC from 1981 until 2012 working out of Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories telling about the people, and the events and adding colour to it all so that the listener could get a feel for what it's like living in the North. She told us this all started when she and a friend complained to the powers that be at the CBC that while there were reports on tennis matches in France and golf tournaments in the USA was never any mention of the dog sled races which were closely followed in the North. The CBC took note and asked her to report on a major race the next day. Watching the race from

a helicopter, Patty-Kay turned what was intended to be three minutes of reporting into a colourful 17minute rant which the producers decided to leave uninterrupted even though it meant an unprecedented postponement of the hourly news report. And thus, her new occupation started. The timing was perfect because the price of furs had dropped considerably and making ends meet had become a challenge. It was clear from her presentation that Patti-Kay must have been a great communicator on the radio. She told us numerous stories from her book which included a plan, abandoned in 1991, to slaughter 4000 bison, the effect of dams on the Peace River and about the efforts to save the whooping cranes from extinction. Her love of the North, its people in those communities and her job as a broadcaster was very evident from her talk. The number of questions from the audience made it clear that she had certainly caught their attention. **Joan Heyland** expressed gratitude of the Club to Patti-Kay for sharing her story with us.
