TRAVELS IN KENYA AND TANZANIA

Gaye Moffett thanked **President Pardeep** for stepping in as a last-minute replacement for today's program. His public service career spanned 25 years in science policy, but his Rotary career has been much more mercurial. He has been a Rotarian for 3 years and is heading into his 2nd year as President of the Rotary Club for West Ottawa. His presentation would not be about science or Rotary but instead about an international journey.

President Pardeep had planned an account of his exchange trip to Russia in June as part of the Canadian Rotary delegation. However, choosing from thousands of photos and preparing a slideshow has not yet been completed so he gave us a slideshow of his and Simmy's safari to Kenya and Tanzania 6 years ago. Although not one word was uttered, the quality of the photographs against the backdrop of uplifting music was a captivating and riveting combination. The room was quiet, eyes glued to the screen, and feet were tapping to the music.

If a picture is worth a thousand words, then an encyclopedic narrative of the beauty and the passion of Kenya and Tanzania unfolded on the screen. There was the piercing gaze of wild animals looking straight into the camera; the universal innocence of baby lions, elephants and rhinos under their mother's watchful eye; storks catching fish by the water shore; a cheetah at rest; and a troop of baboons occupying the middle of the road, creating a mid-day safari traffic jam! It was, however, the photos from the hot air balloon flight that expertly captured the vastness of the territory, and the starkness yet richness of the landscape. The ritualistic Masai tribal dance brought it all back to the celebration of land and culture in society.
