Presentation:

Gaye Moffett introduced our guest speaker Shannon Coombs whom she had met while traveling. The Canadian Consumer Specialty Products Association (CCSPA) represents suppliers of consumer chemical products such as detergents, cleaners, lubricants and pesticides. As CCSPA President, Shannon is the responsible ensuring that CCSPA member interests are effectively conveyed to government regulators and that the public is informed about the safety and effectiveness of members' products.

Shannon started by mentioning that she was a Rotary exchange student to Finland in 1987. The members she assists are a 20-billion-dollar industry. As a lobbyist, she assists her members to handle health and environment regulations which are often politically driven. The CCSPA, for example, is lobbying the Ford government in Ontario to fulfill its election promise to reduce regulations by 25%. Shannon's organization also focuses on public information and for example uses Twitter to discuss recycling issues and promote tick awareness for the prevention of Lyme disease. Shannon is also involved in a hand washing campaign targeted to children under the age of 5 years old. At question time **Jim Maxwell** asked about the extra cost of each province having its own regulatory system but was told this has not been studied.

Don Butler noted that he and probably others had been surprised at how significant the consumer product specialty industry was and thanked Shannon telling us about it **Pres Pardeep** mentioned that Shannon brings a lot to the table. (i.e would be a fine addition to the club)
