THE ROTARY CLUB OF WEST OTTAWA CHARITABLE FOUNDATION (RCWOCF)

Essentially this was the Foundation's 2019 AGM. **Merv Letts** gave a slide presentation (available on request) on the Foundation board, operation, donations to date, and the activities funded. Contributions made to the Foundation are invested and only the earnings are spent. This gives the Club a stable source of funds. Since 2016, Foundation capital has grown to \$143,000, allowing the Club to spend \$2500-\$3000 per year on local initiatives. **Marcia Armstrong** then described ways we can donate to the RCWOCF. **Brett Brooking** demonstrated online donation via CanadaHelps.org. which is also a charity so the 4% administration fee it deducts is included in the charitable tax receipt. **Hadi Mortada** said we could also name the RCWO Foundation as the beneficiary of a life insurance policy and receive a tax-receipt for the yearly premiums. President Pardeep added that the Club used CanadaHelps.org to raise funds for the Bahamas Disaster Relief and it worked well.

PROGRAM:

Marcia Armstrong introduced Amy Nahwegahbow, current President of the Odawa Native Friendship Centre (ONFC) in Ottawa. Amy is Ojibway from the Whitefish First Nation just south of Sudbury. She also works with the First Nations Information Governance Centre.

Amy Nahwegahbow told us the ONFC is a non-profit organization with charitable status that has been providing community services and programs since 1975. Their recent move to the former Rideau High School in partnership with the Rideau-Rockcliffe Community Centre seems to have sparked a renewed energy. Their vision is "Odawa, a thriving and resilient community", and their goal is to improve the quality of life for all Indigenous peoples in the Ottawa area. The ONFC is committed to cultural development, cultural awareness and promoting positive Indigenous images, and facilitates the development of skills, knowledge and leadership amongst Indigenous youth. Cultural events such as powwows offer participation in traditional practices and reach out. Everyone is welcome. Check out the delicious food – especially the Indian tacos! To answer **Ken Murray** Amy said the ONFC welcomes donations of Indigenous art for auctions, or to hang in community locations. To **Don Butler** Amy confirmed ONFC focus is on services, not political advocacy, but they have on occasion e.g. participated in rallies to support Indigenous causes. **Ed Balys** was told there are many Indigenous languages spoken in Ottawa because people come from all over Canada. **Andrew Young** learned that despite residential schools, elders and youth are increasingly acting to preserve and adapt their languages to modern situations.

Merv Letts thanked Amy for telling us about ONFC activities and and confirmed that RCWO donate to End Polio as a thank-you. In addition, Amy was given cheque for \$3,000 from the RCWO Foundation to support the Odawa Native Friendship Centre.
