Program: Final Committee Reports

Youth Service, Jill Yarnell

Due to our Rotary club's strong history of dedication to youth, the Youth Service committee was able to achieve the majority of the goals set out at the beginning of the Rotary Year despite the pandemic which disrupted the Interact Club and the Youth Exchange.

The majority of the programs culminate at the end of the school year and Committee members had to make extra effort to ensure that our school partners were able to achieve their commitments. The Youth Service committee participated in the Interact Club of Woodroffe High School, RYLA, the 4 Way Test Awards, two bursaries, a scholarship, and a Youth Exchange.

Interact Club meetings were held until March at which time school closures necessitated the cancellation of the remainder of the programs. Two students attended the virtual RYLA. Our Club agreed to run a Youth Exchange jointly with RCs Bytown and Ottawa Metro but it was postponed for a year. The outbound student was to go to Denmark and is interested in participating when the program resumes next

year. Bursaries and scholarships totalling \$2500 were awarded and will be presented formally in the fall. The Pallister scholarship will also be given in the fall. Four-Way Test awards have been given at our six elementary school partners.

Club members help chaperone the Woodroffe HS AWAKE program. **Jill** agrees that it is a good idea to have students attend our meetings when appropriate

Community Service, Dave Morton

Thanks for all of the suggestions from Club members. We acted on about half of them. We provide assistance to people and organizations in the community in a time of need. We avoid making donations to large charities and identify ones that are in greater financial need. The grand total of disbursements of \$22,295 went to a very diverse group of local organizations.

We assist the Cityview United Church annually in their provision of Christmas hampers for the Caldwell Community Center. We donated to the Rotary Home comforter campaign, to Kelly McKibbon for family medical expenses, to the Parkdale Food Centre, and to Cornerstone Housing for women. (As an aside, **Peter Fisher** has been donating the proceeds from mask sales to Cornerstone Housing for women.) We donated to The Ottawa Ski Hawks' ski program for the visually impaired and to Sir Robert Borden HS swim program for children who have autism. Mothers at the Youville center received a \$25 gift card each for The Children's Place but no bursary presented because there were no graduation ceremonies.

Many donations were made to food banks for COVID-19 needs. For front line workers' PPE needs, we donated to the Ottawa Hospital foundation as well as to Center 507 drop-in center. The Odawa Native Friendship Centre received both disposable and reusable face masks. Veterans' House (part of MFHI) is nearing completion and we donated toward the programing that will occur there. We also donated to Salvation Army pandemic service needs and to the Hit the Streets direct outreach to the homeless. Overnight summer camps have been cancelled so we donated to virtual camps at Christie Lake and Easter Seals of Ontario.

For next year we have received some suggestions already from Club members. We would like to have representatives of some of these recipients come to speak at our Club meetings.
